

SENATE BILL No. 184

DIGEST OF SB 184 (Updated January 19, 2024 9:28 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 14-28.

Synopsis: Removal of debris from streams. Authorizes a person to remove debris from a stream under certain conditions without the need to obtain a permit from the department of natural resources.

Effective: July 1, 2024.

SENATE BILL No. 184

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 14-28-1-22.4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 22.4. (a) As used in this section,
4	"debris" means:
5	(1) naturally occurring material such as tree limbs; or
6	(2) manmade material;
7	that is lodged in a stream and may impede the natural flow of
8	water in the stream.
9	(b) As used in this section, "stream" means a natural or altered
0	creek or watercourse that:
1	(1) has definable banks and a bed capable of conducting
2	runoff;
3	(2) bears visible evidence of the flow or occurrence of water;
4	and
5	(3) is not:
6	(A) a navigable river, as identified by the commission in
7	the roster of Indiana waterways declared navigable or



1	nonnavigable; or
2	(B) a recreational stream, as designated by the commission
3	under IC 14-29-8.
4	(c) A person may remove debris from a stream under the
5	following conditions:
6	(1) The stream crosses or adjoins land:
7	(A) that the person owns or rents; or
8	(B) on which the person is authorized by the owner or
9	renter to be present for the purposes of debris remova
10	under this section.
l 1	(2) The person removes the debris from the stream using the
12	means that are the safest, in regard to the physical safety of
13	the person removing the debris and others, of the means
14	reasonably available.
15	(3) The person removes the debris from the area of the stream
16	and disposes of the debris in a lawful manner.
17	(4) The person:
18	(A) causes no significant damage to the banks or bed of the
19	stream; and
20	(B) takes reasonable steps to minimize the disturbance of
21	the stream;
22	in removing the debris.
23	(d) A person removing debris from a stream under this section

25	removing the debris, subject to subsection (c)(4).
	(e) The removal of debris from a stream in compliance with this
27	section:
28	(1) is not an excavation prohibited by section 20 of this

30	(2) is not an action for which a permit is required under
31	section 22(c) of this chapter or any other provision of this title
32	(f) This section does not relieve a person of any requirement or
33	restriction that may apply under:
34	(1) Section 404 of the federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C
35	1344); or
36	(2) IC 13-18-22 (State Regulated Wetlands)
