## **SENATE BILL No. 185**

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 3-10-1-24; IC 3-11; IC 3-12-1-2.

**Synopsis:** Initials on ballots at vote centers. Permits a vote center county that uses electronic poll books to print on the back of a ballot card, immediately before the ballot card is delivered to the voter, the initials used by the poll clerks to log into the system (instead of the poll clerks manually initialing the back of each ballot card).

Effective: Upon passage.

# **SENATE BILL No. 185**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 3-10-1-24, AS AMENDED BY P.L.271-2013,
SECTION 12, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 24. (a) A voter who desires to vote must give
the voter's name and political party to the poll clerks of the precinct on
primary election day. In a vote center county using an electronic poll
list, two (2) election officers who are not members of the same
political party must be present when a voter signs in on the
electronic poll list. The poll clerks shall require the voter to write the
following on the poll list or to provide the following information for
entry into the electronic poll list:
(1) The voter's name.
(2) Except as provided in subsection (d), the voter's current
residence address.
(3) The name of the voter's party.
(b) The poll clerks shall:

(1) ask the voter to provide or update the voter's voter



1	identification number;
2	(2) tell the voter the number the voter may use as a voter
3	identification number; and
4	(3) explain to the voter that the voter is not required to provide a
5	voter identification number at the polls.
6	(c) If the voter is unable to sign the voter's name, the voter must sign
7	the poll list by mark, which must be witnessed by one (1) of the poll
8	clerks or assistant poll clerks acting under IC 3-6-6, who shall place the
9	poll clerk's or assistant poll clerk's initials after or under the mark.
10	(d) The electronic poll list (or each line on a poll list sheet provided
11	to take a voter's current residence address) must include a box under
12	the heading "Address Unchanged" so that the voter may check the box
13	instead of writing the voter's current address on the poll list, or if an
14	electronic poll list is used, the poll clerk may check the box after
15	stating to the voter the address shown on the electronic poll list and
16	receiving an oral affirmation from the voter that the voter's residence
17	address shown on the poll list is the voter's current residence address
18	instead of writing the voter's current residence address on the poll list
19	or reentering the address in the electronic poll list.
20	(e) If the voter makes:
21	(1) a written affirmation on the poll list that the voter resides at an
22	address within the precinct but not at the address shown on the
23	poll list for the precinct; or
24	(2) an oral affirmation of a change of address under IC 3-7-39-7;
25	the county election board shall direct the county voter registration
26	office to transfer the individual's voter registration record to the address
27	within the precinct indicated by the voter.
28	SECTION 2. IC 3-11-3-23 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
29	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 23. (a) The cards
30	required by section 22 of this chapter must contain instructions to the
31	voters as to what must be done to:
32	(1) obtain ballots for voting;
33	(2) prepare ballots for voting; and
34	(3) obtain a new ballot in place of one accidentally defaced,
35	mutilated, or spoiled.
36	(b) The cards must contain, in underlined type, the following:
37	(1) That it is a crime to violate Indiana election laws.
38	(2) That the voter should examine the ballot to determine if it
39	contains whether the back of the ballot has:
40	(A) the initials of the poll clerks in ink; or on the back of the
41	<del>ballot.</del>
42	(B) the printed initials of the poll clerks, in a vote center



1 2	county using an electronic poll list that prints on the back of each ballot card, immediately before the ballot card is
3	delivered to the voter, the initials used by the poll clerks to
4	log into the electronic poll book system.
5	(3) That the voter should examine the ballot to determine if the
6	ballot has any mark (other than the initials of the poll clerks)
7	before voting.
8	(4) That the voter should not make any mark on the ballot except
9	a voting mark in the manner provided by IC 3-12-1 because a
10	mark other than a voting mark may void the ballot.
11	(5) That the voter should return the ballot to the poll clerks and
12	request another ballot if:
13	(A) the poll clerks' initials have not been properly placed on
14	the ballot;
15	(B) the ballot has a mark (other than the initials of the poll
16	clerks) before the voter places a voting mark on the ballot; or
17	(C) the voter has improperly marked the ballot.
18	(c) The cards must also set out copies of IC 3-14-2-16,
19	IC 3-14-2-17, IC 3-14-3-10, IC 3-14-3-13, IC 3-14-3-15, IC 3-14-3-16,
20	and IC 3-14-4-9.
21	SECTION 3. IC 3-11-8-10.3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.219-2013,
22	SECTION 40, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
23	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 10.3. (a) As used in this section, "electronic
24	poll list" refers to a poll list that is maintained in a computer data base.
25	(b) An electronic poll list must satisfy all of the following:
26	(1) An electronic poll list must be programmed so that the
27	coordinated action of two (2) election officers who are not
28	members of the same political party is necessary to access the
29	electronic poll list.
30	(2) An electronic poll list may not be connected to a voting
31	system.
32	(3) An electronic poll list may not permit access to voter
33	information other than:
34	(A) information provided on the certified list of voters
35	prepared under IC 3-7-29-1; or
36	(B) information concerning any of the following received or
37	issued after the electronic poll list has been downloaded by the
38	county election board under IC 3-7-29-6:
39	(i) The county's receipt of an absentee ballot from the voter.
40	(ii) The county's receipt of additional documentation
41	provided by the voter to the county voter registration office.
42	(iii) The county's issuance of a certificate of error.



1	(4) The information contained on an electronic poll list must be
2	encrypted and placed on a dedicated, private server to secure
3	connectivity between a precinct polling place or satellite absentee
4	office and the county election board. The electronic poll book
5	must have the capability of:
6	(A) storing (in external or internal memory) a local version of
7	the data base; and
8	(B) producing a list of audit records that reflect all of the
9	idiosyncrasies of the system, including in-process audit
10	records that set forth all transactions.
11	(5) The electronic poll list must permit a poll clerk to enter
12	information regarding an individual who has appeared to vote to
13	verify whether the individual is eligible to vote, and if so, whether
14	the voter has:
15	(A) already cast a ballot at the election;
16	(B) returned an absentee ballot; or
17	(C) submitted any additional documentation required under
18	IC 3-7-33-4.5.
19	(6) After the voter has been provided with a ballot, the electronic
20	poll list must permit a poll clerk to enter information indicating
21	that the voter has voted at the election.
22	(7) The electronic poll list must transmit the information in
23	subdivision (6) to the county election board so that the board may
24	transmit the information immediately to every other polling place
25	or satellite absentee office in the county in which an electronic
26	poll list is being used.
27	(8) The electronic poll list must permit reports to be:
28	(A) generated by a county election board for a watcher
29	appointed under IC 3-6-8 at any time during election day; and
30	(B) electronically transmitted by the county election board to
31	a political party or independent candidate who has appointed
32	a watcher under IC 3-6-8.
33	(9) On each day after absentee ballots are cast before an absentee
34	voter board in the circuit court clerk's office, a satellite office, or
35	a vote center, and after election day, the electronic poll list must
36	permit voter history to be quickly and accurately uploaded into
37	the computerized list.
38	(10) The electronic poll list must be able to display an electronic
39	image of the signature of a voter taken from the voter's
40	registration application, if available.
41	(11) The electronic poll list must be used with a signature pad,



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tablet, or other signature capturing device that permits the voter

1	to make an electronic signature for comparison with the signature
2	displayed under subdivision (10). An image of the electronic
3	signature made by the voter on the signature pad, tablet, or other
4	signature capturing device must be retained and identified as the
5	signature of the voter for the period required for retention under
6	IC 3-10-1-31.1.
7	(12) The electronic poll list must include a bar code reader or
8	tablet that:
9	(A) permits a voter who presents an Indiana driver's license or
10	a state identification card issued under IC 9-24-16 to scan the
11	license or card through the bar code reader or tablet; and
12	(B) has the capability to display the voter's registration record
13	upon processing the information contained within the bar code
14	on the license or card.
15	(13) The electronic poll list used in a vote center county may
16	be programmed to print on the back of a ballot card,
17	immediately before the ballot card is delivered to the voter,
18	the initials used by the poll clerks to log into the electronic
19	poll book system.
20	(13) (14) The electronic poll list must be compatible with:
21 22	(A) any hardware attached to the poll book, such as signature
22	pads, bar code scanners, and network cards;
23	(B) the statewide voter registration system; and
23 24 25	(C) any software system used to prepare voter information to
25	be included on the electronic poll list.
26 27	(14) (15) The electronic poll list must have the ability to be used
27	in conformity with this title for:
28	(A) any type of election conducted in Indiana; or
29	(B) any combination of elections held concurrently with a
30	general election, municipal election, primary election, or
31	special election.
32	(15) (16) The procedures for setting up, using, and shutting down
33	an electronic poll list must:
34	(A) be reasonably easy for a precinct election officer to learn,
35	understand, and perform; and
36	(B) not require a significant amount of training in addition to
37	the training required by IC 3-6-6-40.
38	(16) (17) The electronic poll list must enable a precinct election
39	officer to verify that the electronic poll list:
40	(A) has been set up correctly;
41	(B) is working correctly so as to verify the eligibility of the
42	voter;



1	(C) is correctly recording that a voter has voted; and
2	(D) has been shut down correctly.
3	(17) (18) The electronic poll list must include the following
4	documentation:
5	(A) Plainly worded, complete, and detailed instructions
6	sufficient for a precinct election officer to set up, use, and shut
7	down the electronic poll list.
8	(B) Training materials that:
9	(i) may be in written or video form; and
10	(ii) must be in a format suitable for use at a polling place,
l 1	such as simple "how to" guides.
12	(C) Failsafe data recovery procedures for information included
13	in the electronic poll list.
14	(D) Usability tests:
15	(i) that are conducted by the manufacturer of the electronic
16	poll list using individuals who are representative of the
17	general public;
18	(ii) that include the setting up, using, and shutting down of
19	the electronic poll list; and
20	(iii) that report their results using the ANSI/INCITS -354
21	Common Industry Format (CIF) for Usability Test Reports
22	approved by the American National Standards Institute
23 24	(ANSI) on December 12, 2001.
24	(E) A clear model of the electronic poll list system architecture
25	and the following documentation:
26	(i) End user documentation.
27	(ii) System-level documentation.
28	(iii) Developer documentation.
29	(F) Detailed information concerning:
30	(i) electronic poll list consumables; and
31	(ii) the vendor's supply chain for those consumables.
32	(G) Vendor internal quality assurance procedures and any
33	internal or external test data and reports available to the
34	vendor concerning the electronic poll list.
35	(H) Repair and maintenance policies for the electronic poll
36	list.
37	(I) As of the date of the vendor's application for approval of
38	the electronic poll list by the secretary of state as required by
39	<del>IC</del> 3-11-18.1-12(2), <b>IC</b> 3-11-18.1-12, the following:
10	(i) A list of customers who are using or have previously used
11	the vendor's electronic poll list.
12	(ii) A description of any known anomalies involving the



1	functioning of the electronic poll list, including how those
2	anomalies were resolved.
3	(18) (19) The electronic poll list and any hardware attached to the
4	poll book must be designed to prevent injury or damage to any
5	individual or the hardware, including fire and electrical hazards.
6	(19) (20) The electronic poll list must demonstrate that it correctly
7	processes all activity regarding each voter registration record
8	included on the list, including the use, alteration, storage, and
9	transmittal of information that is part of the record. Compliance
10	with this subdivision requires the mapping of the data life cycle
11	of the voter registration record as processed by the electronic poll
12	list.
13	(20) (21) The electronic poll list must successfully perform in
14	accordance with all representations concerning functionality,
15	usability, security, accessibility, and sustainability made in the
16	vendor's application for approval of the electronic poll list by the
17	secretary of state as required by IC 3-11-18.1-12(2).
18	IC 3-11-18.1-12.
19	(21) (22) The electronic poll list must have the capacity to
20	transmit all information generated by the voter or poll clerk as
21	part of the process of casting a ballot, including the time and date
22	stamp indicating when the voter voted, and the electronic
23	signature of the voter, for retention on the dedicated private server
24	maintained by the county election board for the period required
25	by Indiana and federal law.
26	(22) (23) The electronic poll list must:
27	(A) permit a voter to sign the poll list even when there is a
28	temporary interruption in connectivity to the Internet; and
29	(B) provide for the uploading of each signature and its
30	assignment to the voter's registration record.
31	SECTION 4. IC 3-11-8-25.1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.219-2013,
32	SECTION 45, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
33	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 25.1. (a) Except as provided in subsection (e),
34	a voter who desires to vote an official ballot at an election shall provide
35	proof of identification.
36	(b) Except as provided in subsection (e), before the voter proceeds
37	to vote in the election, a precinct election officer shall ask the voter to
38	provide proof of identification. One (1) of each of the precinct election
39	officers nominated by each county chairman of a major political party
40	of the county under IC 3-6-6-8 or IC 3-6-6-9 is entitled to ask the voter
41	to provide proof of identification. The voter shall produce the proof of
42	identification to each precinct officer requesting the proof of

identification to each precinct officer requesting the proof of



identification before being permitted to sign the poll list.

(c) If:

3	(1) the voter is unable or declines to present the proof of
4	identification; or
5	(2) a member of the precinct election board determines that the
6	proof of identification provided by the voter does not qualify as
7	proof of identification under IC 3-5-2-40.5;
8	a member of the precinct election board shall challenge the voter as
9	prescribed by this chapter.
10	(d) If the voter executes a challenged voter's affidavit under section
11	22.1 of this chapter, the voter may:
12	(1) sign the poll list; and
13	(2) receive a provisional ballot.
14	(e) A voter who votes in person at a precinct polling place that is
15	located at a state licensed care facility where the voter resides is not
16	required to provide proof of identification before voting in an election.
17	(f) After a voter has passed the challengers or has been sworn in, the
18	voter shall be instructed by a member of the precinct election board to
19	proceed to the location where the poll clerks are stationed. In a vote
20	center county using an electronic poll list, two (2) election officers
21	who are not members of the same political party must be present
22	when a voter signs in on the electronic poll list. The voter shall
23	announce the voter's name to the poll clerks or assistant poll clerks. A
24	poll clerk, an assistant poll clerk, or a member of the precinct election
25	board shall require the voter to write the following on the poll list or to
26	provide the following information for entry into the electronic poll list:
27	(1) The voter's name.
28	(2) Except as provided in subsection (k), the voter's current
29	residence address.
30	(g) The poll clerk, an assistant poll clerk, or a member of the
31	precinct election board shall:
32	(1) ask the voter to provide or update the voter's voter
33	identification number;
34	(2) tell the voter the number the voter may use as a voter
35	identification number; and
36	(3) explain to the voter that the voter is not required to provide or
37	update a voter identification number at the polls.
38	(h) The poll clerk, an assistant poll clerk, or a member of the
39	precinct election board shall ask the voter to provide proof of
40	identification.
41	(i) In case of doubt concerning a voter's identity, the precinct

election board shall compare the voter's signature with the signature on



the affidavit of registration or any certified copy of the signature provided under IC 3-7-29 or enter the information into the electronic poll list. If the board determines that the voter's signature is authentic, the voter may then vote. If either poll clerk doubts the voter's identity following comparison of the signatures, the poll clerk shall challenge the voter in the manner prescribed by section 21 of this chapter.

- (j) If, in a precinct governed by subsection (g):
  - (1) the poll clerk does not execute a challenger's affidavit; or
  - (2) the voter executes a challenged voter's affidavit under section 22.1 of this chapter or executed the affidavit before signing the poll list;

the voter may then vote.

- (k) The electronic poll list (or each line on a poll list sheet provided to take a voter's current address) must include a box under the heading "Address Unchanged" so that the voter may check the box instead of writing the voter's current address on the poll list, or if an electronic poll list is used, the poll clerk may check the box after stating to the voter the address shown on the electronic poll list and receiving an oral affirmation from the voter that the voter's residence address shown on the poll list is the voter's current residence address instead of writing the voter's current residence address on the poll list or reentering the address in the electronic poll list.
- (1) If the voter indicates that the voter's current residence is located within another county in Indiana, the voter is considered to have directed the county voter registration office of the county where the precinct is located to cancel the voter registration record within the county. The precinct election board shall provide the voter with a voter registration application for the voter to complete and file with the county voter registration office of the county where the voter's current residence address is located.
- (m) If the voter indicates that the voter's current residence is located outside Indiana, the voter is considered to have directed the county voter registration office of the county where the precinct is located to cancel the voter registration record within the county.
- SECTION 5. IC 3-11-13-19 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 19. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), each circuit court clerk shall print or stamp the precinct number or designation and a line for each poll clerk's initials on both a ballot card and the ballot card's secrecy envelope before the election.
- (b) In a vote center county using an electronic poll list, the circuit court clerk shall not print or stamp the information



required by subsection (a) if the precinct number or designation

and the initials used by the poll clerks to log into the electronic poll

3	book system are printed on the back of each ballot card
4	immediately before the ballot card is delivered to the voter.
5	SECTION 6. IC 3-11-13-28 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
6	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 28. (a) This section
7	does not apply to a ballot card voted by absentee ballot.
8	(b) Except as provided in subsection (c), the two (2) poll clerks of
9	each precinct shall place their initials in ink on the back of each ballot
10	card at the time the card is issued to a voter. The initials must be in the
11	poll clerks' ordinary handwriting or printing and without a
12	distinguishing mark of any kind.
13	(c) In a vote center county using an electronic poll list, the
14	initials used by the poll clerks to log into the electronic poll book
15	system may be printed on the back of each ballot card immediately
16	before the ballot card is delivered to the voter.
17	(e) (d) Except as provided in IC 3-12-1-12, a ballot card is not valid
18	unless, immediately before the ballot card is delivered to the voter:
19	(1) the ballot card is initialed by both poll clerks; or
20	(2) the initials of both poll clerks are printed on the back of
21	the ballot card in accordance with subsection (c).
22	SECTION 7. IC 3-11-13-29, AS AMENDED BY P.L.164-2006,
23	SECTION 116, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
24	[EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 29. (a) In addition to the
25	instructions printed on the ballot card or ballot labels, instructions to
26	voters shall be posted in each voting booth or placed on the marking
27	device. Each voter shall be instructed by both judges, on request, on
28	how to operate the voting device before the voter enters the voting
29	booth.
30	(b) The instructions posted in the voting booth or placed on the
31	marking device must state the following:
32	(1) That the voter should examine the ballot card to determine if
33	it contains whether the back of the ballot card has:
34	(A) the initials of the poll clerks in ink; or on the back of the
35	<del>card.</del>
36	(B) the printed initials of the poll clerks, in a vote center
37	county using an electronic poll list that prints on the back
38	of each ballot card, immediately before the ballot card is
39	delivered to the voter, the initials used by the poll clerks to
40	log into the electronic poll book system.
41	(2) That the voter should not make an unnecessary mark on the

ballot card because the mark may void the card.



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1 2	(3) That the voter should examine the ballot card to determine if the card has any mark (other than the initials of the poll clerks)
3	before voting.
4	(4) That the voter should return the ballot card to the poll clerks
5	and request another ballot card if:
6	(A) the poll clerks' initials have not been properly placed on
7	the card;
8	(B) the card has a mark (other than the initials of the poll
9	clerks) before the voter places a voting mark on the ballot; or
10	(C) the voter has improperly marked the card.
11	(5) That the voter should examine the ballot card after voting to
12	determine that all marks made on the card to indicate the voter's
13	selections have been completely marked.
14	(c) As provided by 42 U.S.C. 15481, a voter casting an optical scan
15	ballot card under this section must be:
16	(1) permitted to verify in a private and independent manner the
17	votes selected by the voter before the ballot is cast and counted;
18	(2) provided the opportunity to change the ballot or correct any
19	error in a private and independent manner before the ballot is cast
20	and counted, including the opportunity to receive a replacement
21	ballot if the voter is otherwise unable to change or correct the
22	ballot; and
23	(3) notified before the ballot is cast regarding the effect of casting
24	multiple votes for the office and provided an opportunity to
25	correct the ballot before the ballot is cast and counted.
26	SECTION 8. IC 3-11-18.1-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.258-2013,
27	SECTION 81, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
28	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 4. The plan required by section 3 of this
29	chapter must include at least the following:
30	(1) The total number of vote centers to be established.
31	(2) The location of each vote center.
32	(3) The effective date of the order.
33	(4) The following information according to the computerized list
34	(as defined in IC 3-7-26.3-2) as of the date of the order:
35	(A) The total number of voters within the county.
36	(B) The number of active voters within the county.
37	(C) The number of inactive voters within the county.
38	(5) For each vote center designated under subdivision (2), a list
39	of the precincts whose polls will be located at the vote center
40	consistent with section 13 of this chapter for an election that is not
41	being held in each precinct of the county.
42	(6) For each vote center designated under subdivision (2), the



1	number of precinct election boards that will be appointed to
2	administer an election at the vote center.
3	(7) For each precinct election board designated under subdivision
4	(6), the number and name of each precinct the precinct election
5	board will administer consistent with section 13 of this chapter for
6	an election that is not being held in each precinct of the county.
7	(8) For each vote center designated under subdivision (2), the
8	number and title of the precinct election officers who will be
9	appointed to serve at the vote center.
10	(9) For each vote center designated under subdivision (2):
11	(A) the number and type of ballot variations that will be
12	provided at the vote center; and
13	(B) whether these ballots will be:
14	(i) delivered to the vote center before the opening of the
15	polls; or
16	(ii) printed on demand for a voter's use.
17	(10) A detailed description of any hardware, firmware, or
18	software used:
19	(A) to create an electronic poll list for each precinct whose
20	polls are to be located at a vote center; or
21	(B) to establish a secure electronic connection between the
22	county election board and the precinct election officials
23	administering a vote center.
24	(11) A description of the equipment and procedures to be used to
25	ensure that information concerning a voter entered into any
26	electronic poll list used by precinct election officers at a vote
27	center is immediately accessible to:
28	(A) the county election board; and
29	(B) the electronic poll lists used by precinct election officers
30	at all other vote centers in the county.
31	(12) For each precinct designated under subdivision (5), the
32	number of electronic poll lists to be provided for the precinct.
33	(13) This subdivision applies to a county in which ballot cards
34	are used at a vote center. For each vote center designated
35	under subdivision (2), whether each ballot card printed will
36	have the initials used by the poll clerks to log into the
37	electronic poll book system printed on the back of the ballot
38	card immediately before the ballot card is delivered to a
39	voter.
40	(13) (14) The security and contingency plans to be implemented
41	by the county to do all of the following:
42	(A) Prevent a disruption of the vote center process.



1	(B) Ensure that the election is properly conducted if a
2	disruption occurs.
3	(C) Prevent access to an electronic poll list without the
4	coordinated action of two (2) precinct election officers who are
5	not members of the same political party.
6	(14) (15) A certification that the vote center complies with the
7	accessibility requirements applicable to polling places under
8	IC 3-11-8.
9	(15) (16) A sketch depicting the planned layout of the vote center,
10	indicating the location of:
11	(A) equipment; and
12	(B) precinct election officers;
13	within the vote center.
14	(16) (17) The total number and locations of satellite offices to be

29	SECTION 9. IC 3-12-1-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
30	[EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 2. (a) This section does not
31	apply to absentee ballots.
32	(b) The whole ballot may not be counted, subject to section 12 of
33	this chapter, if the ballot is not endorsed or printed with the initials of
34	the poll clerks in accordance with state law.
