

SENATE BILL No. 188

DIGEST OF SB 188 (Updated January 23, 2019 12:41 pm - DI 133)

Citations Affected: IC 21-13.

Synopsis: Nursing faculty loan repayment grant program. Establishes the nursing faculty loan repayment grant program (program) to increase the number of nursing faculty in Indiana. Requires the commission for higher education to administer the program. Establishes the nursing faculty loan repayment grant fund. Sets forth requirements for an individual to participate in the program.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 21-13-1-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.148-2016,
2	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 5. "Fund":
4	(1) for purposes of IC 21-13-2, refers to the William A. Crawford
5	minority teacher scholarship fund established by IC 21-13-2-1;
6	(2) for purposes of IC 21-13-4, refers to the National Guard
7	tuition supplement program fund established by IC 21-13-4-1;
8	(3) for purposes of IC 21-13-5, refers to the National Guard
9	scholarship extension fund established by IC 21-13-5-1;
10	(4) for purposes of IC 21-13-6, refers to the primary care
11	physician loan forgiveness fund established by IC 21-13-6-3; and
12	(5) for purposes of IC 21-13-6.5, refers to the medical residency
13	education fund established by IC 21-13-6.5-1; and
14	(6) for purposes of IC 21-13-9.5, refers to the nursing faculty
15	loan repayment grant fund established by IC 21-13-9.5-3.
16	SECTION 2. IC 21-13-9.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
17	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

2	Chapter 9.5. Nursing Faculty Loan Repayment Grant Program
3	Sec. 1. (a) The nursing faculty loan repayment grant program
4	is established for the purpose of increasing the number of
5	educators and adjunct clinical faculty teaching in the field of
6	nursing education in Indiana by assisting in the repayment of
7	qualified student loans.
8	(b) The commission shall administer the program. The
9	commission may consult with the Indiana state board of nursing in
10	implementing and administering the program.
11	Sec. 2. To qualify for a grant under this chapter to assist in the
12	repayment of student loans, an individual must meet the following
13	requirements:
14	(1) Be a resident of Indiana and have resided in Indiana for
15	twelve (12) consecutive months before applying for the grant.
16	(2) Be a United States citizen or an alien who is admitted into
17	the United States for lawful, permanent residence.
18	(3) Be a registered nurse licensed under IC 25-23.
19	(4) Either:
20	(A) hold a:
21	(i) bachelor's degree in nursing and have practiced in the
22	subject field in which the individual is teaching;
23	(ii) graduate degree in nursing; or
24	(iii) doctoral degree for qualification as nursing faculty
25	or adjunct clinical faculty; or
26	(B) be enrolled in a graduate degree program for
27	qualification as nursing faculty or adjunct clinical faculty.
28	(5) Be employed as a nursing faculty member or an adjunct
29	clinical faculty member providing classroom or clinical
30	instruction at a nursing school located in Indiana for the
31	equivalent of at least twelve (12) credit hours during an
32	annual period beginning July 1 and ending June 30.
33	(6) Have an outstanding balance on an eligible student loan on
34	an undergraduate, graduate, or doctorate level nursing degree
35	for qualification as nursing faculty or adjunct clinical faculty,
36	that:
37	(A) holds a non-default status; and
38	(B) is under any Indiana or federal education loan
39	program.
40	Sec. 3. (a) The nursing faculty loan repayment grant fund is
41	established to meet the purpose set forth in section 1 of this



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chapter. The fund consists of the following:

1	(1) Appropriations from the general assembly.
2	(2) Money collected and deposited in the fund.
3	(3) Gifts to the program.
4	(b) The commission shall administer the fund.
5	(c) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
6	money in the fund.
7	(d) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund no
8	currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same
9	manner as other public funds. Interest that accrues from those
10	investments shall be deposited in the fund.
11	(e) Money in the fund at the end of a fiscal year does not rever
12	to the state general fund but remains available to be used to
13	provide money for student loan forgiveness payments under this
14	chapter.
15	Sec. 4. (a) The money in the fund must be used to provide
16	annual student loan forgiveness payments to nurses who meet the
17	requirements set forth in section 2 of this chapter and who are
18	approved by the commission to participate in the program.
19	(b) A grant awarded in a particular year under this chapter is
20	equal to the lesser of the following amounts:
21	(1) The balance of the recipient's total amount of eligible
22	student loans.
23	(2) Five thousand dollars (\$5,000).
24	(c) An individual may not be awarded more than twenty-five
25	thousand dollars (\$25,000) under this program during the
26	individual's lifetime.
27	Sec. 5. Each:
28	(1) applicant under this chapter; and
29	(2) nurse approved under this chapter;
30	shall provide to the commission any information that the
31	commission determines is necessary to administer this chapter.
