DIGEST OF SB 189 (Updated February 23, 2016 8:48 am - DI 116)

**Citations Affected:** IC 20-19.

**Synopsis:** Identifier for military families. Provides that information concerning attendance records and academic progress for a student attending an adult high school who is a member of the military or children in military families must be submitted to the department of education by each school corporation and charter school. Provides that the information collected by a school corporation or charter school is considered confidential and shall be collected by the school corporation or charter school under guidelines for maintaining confidentiality established by the department.

**Effective:** July 1, 2016.

## ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 189

---

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-19-3-9.4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.43-2014,  
2 SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
3 JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 9.4. (a) Beginning January 1, 2010, the  
4 department may obtain and maintain student test number information  
5 in a manner and form that permits any person who is authorized to  
6 review the information to:  
7 (1) access the information at any time; and  
8 (2) accurately determine:  
9 (A) where each student is enrolled and attending classes; and  
10 (B) the number of students enrolled in a school corporation or  
11 charter school and residing in the area served by a school  
12 corporation;  
13 as of any date after December 31, 2009, occurring before two (2)  
14 regular instructional days before the date of the inquiry.  
15 Each school corporation and charter school shall provide the  
16 information to the department in the form and on a schedule that  
17 permits the department to comply with this section. The department

1 shall provide technical assistance to school corporations and charter  
 2 schools to assist school corporations and charter schools in complying  
 3 with this section.

4 (b) Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, each school  
 5 corporation and charter school shall annually:

6 (1) determine, **on a form prescribed by the department,**  
 7 **whether a student who attends an adult high school (as defined**  
 8 **under IC 20-24-1-2.3) or a student's parent or a member of the**  
 9 **same household** is a member of:

10 (A) the armed forces of the United States who is on active  
 11 duty;

12 (B) the reserve component of a branch of the armed forces of  
 13 the United States; or

14 (C) the national guard; and

15 (2) provide **to the department** a list ~~to the department~~ of the  
 16 students who have been identified under subdivision (1).

17 **The information collected by a school corporation or charter**  
 18 **school under subdivision (1) is considered confidential and shall be**  
 19 **collected by the school corporation or charter school under**  
 20 **guidelines for maintaining confidentiality established by the**  
 21 **department.** The department shall assign each student identified under  
 22 subdivision (1) a unique identifier, which may be a modification of the  
 23 student's test number assigned under subsection (a), by which data  
 24 concerning military connected students may be disaggregated,  
 25 **including information concerning attendance records and**  
 26 **academic progress.**
