DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-43-2-7.5.

Synopsis: K-12 funding. Permits the budget agency to transfer from the state tuition reserve account to the state general fund the amount necessary to offset a reduction in basic tuition support, special education grants, or career and technical education grants as a result of actual enrollment counts exceeding the enrollment projection estimates. Limits the transfer to \$25,000,000 in a state fiscal year.

Effective: Upon passage.

SENATE BILL No. 189

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 20-43-2-7.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.217-2017,
SECTION 118, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
[EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 7.5. (a) Before July 1 of each
year, the budget agency, with the assistance of the department, shall
estimate the amount of the distributions that will be made for choice
scholarships for the following state fiscal year.
(b) In a state fiscal year, beginning after June 30, 2016, the budget
agency may transfer money from the state tuition reserve account to the
state general fund if the budget director, after review by the budget
committee, makes a determination that the amount of the distribution
for that state fiscal year for:
(1) basic tuition support has been reduced under section 3 of this
chapter because the amount of the distributions for choice
scholarships for the state fiscal year; or
(2) basic tuition support, special education grants, or career
and technical education grants has been reduced under
section 3 of this chapter because the ADM count, the count of



1	eligible pupils enrolled in special education programs, or the
2	count of students for career and technical education grants;
3	exceeds the latest estimate prepared by the legislative services agency
4	and provided to members of the general assembly before May 1 of the
5	most recent odd-numbered year concerning the amount of the
6	distributions for choice scholarships these amounts for the state fiscal
7	year beginning July 1 of the particular state fiscal year.
8	(c) The maximum amount that may be transferred to the state
9	general fund under this subsection (b)(1) for the state fiscal year may
10	not exceed the lesser of:
11	(1) the amount of the reduction in basic tuition support
12	distributions described in this subsection; subsection (b)(1); or
13	(2) twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000).
14	(d) The maximum amount that may be transferred to the state
15	general fund under subsection (b)(2) for the state fiscal year may
16	not exceed the lesser of:
17	(1) the amount of the reduction in distributions described in
18	subsection (b)(2); or
19	(2) twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000) for the state fiscal
20	year.
21	(e) Any amounts transferred under this subsection section shall be
22	used to augment the appropriation for state tuition support for the state
23	fiscal year and shall be distributed to school corporations to restore the
24	distributions for basic tuition support, special education grants,
25	career and technical education grants, or a combination of these
26	distributions that are reduced under section 3 of this chapter.
27	(c) (f) Transfers under this section are in addition to any transfers
28	made from the state tuition reserve account under IC 4-12-1-15.7 or
29	any other law.
30	(d) (g) This section expires June 30, 2019.
31	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
