A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 9-21-8-57, AS AMENDED BY P.L.259-2013,
2	SECTION 17, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 57. (a) A golf cart or off-road vehicle may not be
4	operated on a highway except:
5	(1) in accordance with:
6	(1) (A) an ordinance adopted under IC 9-21-1-3(a)(14) and
7	IC 9-21-1-3.3(a) authorizing the operation of a golf cart or an
8	off-road vehicle on the highway; or
9	(2) (B) IC 14-16-1-20 authorizing an off-road vehicle to
0	operate on a highway; and
1	(2) in the case of a golf cart operated on a state highway that
2	is not included in the interstate system (as defined in
3	IC 8-23-1-25), in a way that allows the golf cart to be operated
4	on the state highway:
5	(A) where there is sufficient width to operate:
6	(i) in the right-hand lane available for traffic; or
7	(ii) as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge



1	of the highway;
2	(B) in a manner that does not impede traffic; and
3	(C) in a manner so as not to endanger life or property.
4	(b) A golf cart operating under subsection (a)(2) may operate on
5	a traveled part of the highway not described in subsection (a)(2)(A)
6	when:
7	(1) overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the
8	same direction; or
9	(2) preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into a private
10	road or driveway.
