DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 5-16-9; IC 9-18.5.

Synopsis: Modified symbol of access. Requires that parking signs for accessible parking spaces for an individual with a physical disability must bear, instead of the international symbol of accessibility (also known as the international wheelchair symbol), the modified symbol of access when erected, replaced, or repaired after December 31, 2019. Requires that license plates and placards issued by the bureau of motor vehicles for display in or on a vehicle used to transport a person with a disability must bear, rather than the international symbol of accessibility, the modified symbol of access on all new license plates or duplicate or replacement plates after December 31, 2019.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

3	different location from other parking spaces if the location of the
4	accessible spaces results in equivalent or greater access by the shortest
5	accessible route of travel to an accessible entrance of:

23	accessible parking spaces.
24	(e) The reserved space or spaces under this chapter must be reserved
25	by posting immediately adjacent to and visible from the space or spaces
26	a vertical sign measuring at least forty-eight (48) inches from the base
27	of the sign, located in a manner that will not be obscured by a vehicle
28	parked in the space, and bearing the following:
29	(1) The international symbol of accessibility. As specified in
30	subsection (f), either the modified symbol of access or the
31	international symbol of accessibility.
32	(2) Letters and numbers that have a width to height ratio between
33	3:5 and 1:1 and a stroke width to height ratio between 1:5 and
34	1:10.
35	(3) Characters and numbers that are sized according to the
36	distance from which the characters and numbers are read, with the
37	minimum height measured by an uppercase "X". Lowercase
38	characters may be used.
39	(f) In addition to the requirements set forth in subsection (e), the
40	sign required by subsection (e) must display:
41	(1) for a sign erected, replaced, or repaired before January 1,
42	2020, the international symbol of accessibility; or
