### **SENATE BILL No. 192**

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 34-30-13.

**Synopsis:** Immunity for health care volunteers. Provides that a licensed health care worker who provides voluntary health care services in a setting other than a medical clinic or health care facility is immune from civil liability. Provides that the person is not immune from civil liability if the damages resulted from the person's gross negligence or willful misconduct.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

## **SENATE BILL No. 192**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning civil law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 34-30-13-1.3 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 1.3. (a) This section does not
4	apply to health care services that are provided at a medical clinic
5	or health care facility.
6	(b) Except as provided in section 2 of this chapter, a person who
7	meets the following criteria is immune from civil liability resulting
8	from any act or omission relating to the provision of health care
9	services:
10	(1) Has licensure to provide health care services under
11	Indiana law.
12	(2) Voluntarily provides to another person without
13	compensation health care services within the scope of the
14	person's license.
15	(3) Provides the health care services in any setting other than
16	a setting described in subsection (a).



SECTION 2. IC 34-30-13-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 2. A person described
in section 1, 1.3, or 1.5 of this chapter is not immune from civil
liability if the damages resulting from the provision of the health care
services resulted from the person's gross negligence or willful
misconduct.
