Synopsis: Voter challenges in primaries. Eliminates voter challenges at a primary election based on party affiliation.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

SENATE BILL No. 194

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 3-5-4.5-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.164-2006,
2 SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 3. ~~Except as permitted in a primary election under~~
4 ~~IC 3-10-1~~, A person may not challenge the right of an individual to vote
5 at an election in the precinct solely on the basis of the individual's:
6 (1) actual or perceived affiliation with a political party; or
7 (2) support or opposition to a candidate or the adoption of a
8 public question.
9 SECTION 2. IC 3-10-1-9 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
10 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 9. A voter in a precinct may
11 challenge a voter or person who offers to vote at a primary election.
12 The challenged person may not vote unless the challenged person:
13 (1) is registered; **and**
14 (2) makes:
15 (A) an oral or a written affirmation under IC 3-10-12; or
16 (B) an affidavit:
17 (i) that the challenged person is a voter of the precinct; or

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- 1 (ii) required under IC 3-10-11 if the voter declares that the
 2 voter is entitled to vote under IC 3-10-11. ~~and~~
 3 ~~(3) either:~~
 4 ~~(A) at the last general election voted for a majority of the~~

13 SECTION 3. IC 3-10-1-10 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
 14 2019]. ~~Sec. 10: Only a voter who is a member of the political party for~~

 16 ~~challenge the person on the ground of party affiliation.~~

17 SECTION 4. IC 3-10-1-10.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.128-2015,
 18 SECTION 150, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
 19 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 10.5. ~~(a) This section does not~~
 20 ~~apply to a voter who is challenged under section 10 of this chapter on~~
 21 ~~the basis of party affiliation.~~

22 ~~(b) In accordance with 52 U.S.C. 21082, a voter challenged under~~
 23 ~~this chapter is entitled to cast a provisional ballot under IC 3-11.7 after~~
 24 ~~executing the affidavit under section 9 of this chapter.~~
