



### SENATE BILL No. 195

DIGEST OF SB 195 (Updated January 21, 2020 2:30 pm - DI 110)

Citations Affected: IC 20-32.

Synopsis: Career and technical education clusters. Requires the state board of education (state board) to approve, for purposes of career and technical education graduation pathways, a career and technical education cluster that allows students to acquire knowledge and skills related to employment in the electric, natural gas, communications, water, and wastewater utility industries. Requires the governor's workforce cabinet (cabinet), in consultation with the state board, department of education, and department of workforce development, to create course sequences for the career and technical education cluster. Provides that, in creating one or more course sequences concerning the utility career cluster, the cabinet shall: (1) consider the impact of course sequences on long term outcomes of students; and (2) prioritize course sequences that lead to high wage, high demand jobs. Provides that certain requirements apply to career clusters approved or amended and course sequences created or amended after July 1, 2020. Requires the cabinet to: (1) collect data each year regarding approved career clusters and course sequences to inform decision making around approving, creating, and amending current and future career clusters and course sequence requirements; and (2) prepare and submit, not later than November 1 of each year, a report to the legislative council regarding the collected data.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

## **SENATE BILL No. 195**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning utilities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-32-4-15 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2020]: Sec. 15. (a) The following definitions apply throughout
4	this section:
5	(1) "Utility career cluster" means a list:
6	(A) compiled for purposes of college and career pathways
7	relating to career and technical education under section
8	1.5(g) of this chapter; and
9	(B) setting forth industries or occupational fields that:
0	(i) are related to the provision of utility services; and
1	(ii) share similar knowledge and skill training
2	requirements.
3	(2) "Utility services" includes:
4	(A) production, transmission, or distribution of electricity;
5	(B) acquisition, transportation, distribution, or storage of
6	natural gas;
7	(C) provision of communications service (as defined in



1	IC 8-1-32.5-3);
2	(D) treatment, storage, or distribution of water; and
3	(E) collection or treatment of wastewater.
4	(b) Not later than December 31, 2020:
5	(1) the state board shall, for purposes of developing sequences
6	of courses leading to student concentrators in industries or
7	occupational fields related to the provision of utility services
8	under section 1.5(g) of this chapter, approve a utility career
9	cluster; and
10	(2) the governor's workforce cabinet, in consultation with the
11	state board, department, and department of workforce
12	development, shall create one (1) or more course sequences:
13	(A) each of which is comprised of courses approved by the
14	state board for purposes of college and career pathways
15	relating to career and technical education under section
16	1.5(g) of this chapter; and
17	(B) each of which provides students with knowledge and
18	skills necessary for employment in an industry or
19	occupational field in the utility career cluster.
20	(c) In creating one (1) or more course sequences under
21	subsection (b)(2), the governor's workforce cabinet, in consultation
22	with the state board, department, and department of workforce
23	development, shall:
24	(1) consider the impact of course sequences on the long term
25	outcomes of students; and
26	(2) prioritize course sequences that lead to high wage, high
27	demand jobs.
28	SECTION 2. IC 20-32-4-16 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
29	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
30	1, 2020]: Sec. 16. (a) Section 15(c) of this chapter and this section
31	apply to any:
32	(1) career clusters approved or amended, after July 1, 2020
33	by the state board; or
34	(2) course sequences leading to student concentrators created
35	or amended, after July 1, 2020, by the governor's workforce
36	cabinet in consultation with the state board, department, and
37	department of workforce development.
38	(b) The governor's workforce cabinet shall do the following:
39	(1) Collect data each year regarding approved career clusters
40	and course sequences to inform decision making around
41	approving, creating, and amending current and future career
42	clusters and course sequence requirements.



1	(2) Prepare and submit, not later than November 1 of each
2	year, a report to the legislative council in an electronic forma
3	under IC 5-14-6 regarding the data collected under

#### COMMITTEE REPORT

Madam President: The Senate Committee on Education and Career Development, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 195, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

Page 2, after line 19, begin a new paragraph and insert:

- "(c) In creating one (1) or more course sequences under subsection (b)(2), the governor's workforce cabinet, in consultation with the state board and the commission for higher education, shall:
  - (1) consider the impact of course sequences on the long term outcomes of students; and
  - (2) prioritize course sequences that lead to high wage, high demand jobs.

SECTION 2. IC 20-32-4-16 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 16. (a) Section 15(c) of this chapter and this section apply to any:

- (1) career clusters approved or amended, after July 1, 2020, by the state board; or
- (2) course sequences leading to student concentrators created or amended, after July 1, 2020, by the governor's workforce cabinet in consultation with the state board and the commission for higher education.
- (b) The governor's workforce cabinet shall do the following:
  - (1) Collect data each year regarding approved career clusters and course sequences to inform decision making around approving, creating, and amending current and future career clusters and course sequence requirements.
  - (2) Prepare and submit, not later than November 1 of each year, a report to the legislative council in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6 regarding the data collected under subdivision (1).".
