DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Educational support professionals study commission. Creates a commission to identify information concerning educational support professionals in each school corporation. Requires the commission to report its findings to the general assembly.

Effective: July 1, 2022.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2022] (a) As used in this

34	vice chairperson of the commission.
35	(h) A quorum of the commission consists of six (6) members

38	(i) The department of education shall staff the commission.
39	(j) The commission shall do the following with respect to each

11	(k) The department of education shall submit relevant
12	information described in subsection (j) to the commission.
13	(1) Each school corporation shall cooperate with the department
14	of education to provide information requested by the commission.
15	(m) Each member of the commission who is not a state employee
16	is entitled to reimbursement for traveling expenses as provided
17	under IC 4-13-1-4 and other expenses actually incurred in
18	connection with the member's duties as provided in the state
19	policies and procedures established by the department of
20	administration and approved by the budget agency.
21	(n) Each member of the commission who is a state employee is
22	entitled to reimbursement for traveling expenses as provided under
23	IC 4-13-1-4 and other expenses actually incurred in connection
24	with the member's duties as provided in the state policies and
25	procedures established by the department of administration and
26	approved by the budget agency.
27	(o) Not later than November 1, 2023, the commission shall
28	report the commission's findings made under subsection (j) to the
29	general assembly. The report to the general assembly must be in an
30	electronic format under IC 5-14-6.

(p) This SECTION expires December 31, 2023.
