## **SENATE BILL No. 206**

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 35-46-1-13.5.

**Synopsis:** Financial exploitation of seniors. Requires a person who has reason to believe that an individual at least 65 years of age is being exploited to report the suspected exploitation to a law enforcement agency, and makes a knowing failure to report a Class B misdemeanor. Requires a law enforcement agency that receives a report to notify the attorney general of the offense, and requires the attorney general to notify the appropriate licensor or regulator if the offense involves a licensed person or regulated entity.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

### **SENATE BILL No. 206**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 35-46-1-13.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 13.5. (a) A person who:
4	(1) believes or has reason to believe that a person is
5	unlawfully exerting unauthorized control over:
6	(A) the personal services or property of;
7	(B) Social Security benefits payable to;
8	(C) the benefits from a program listed in IC 8-23-17-8 that
9	are payable to or accrue to the benefit of; or
10	(D) the benefits from any other retirement, disability,
11	pension, or similar program that are payable to;
12	an individual at least sixty-five (65) years of age; and
13	(2) knowingly fails to report the facts supporting that belief to
14	a law enforcement agency in the county of residence of the
15	individual who is at least sixty-five (65) years of age;
16	commits a Class B misdemeanor.



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1 (b) Upon receipt of a report under subsection (a), the law 2 enforcement agency shall notify the attorney general of the facts 3 and circumstances of the offense. If the offense involves a licensed 4 person or regulated entity, the attorney general shall notify the 5 appropriate licensor or regulator.



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
