## **SENATE BILL No. 211**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 34-23.5; IC 34-30-32-1.

**Synopsis:** COVID-19 vaccine or mask mandate cause of action. Provides a cause of action for an individual who experiences an adverse medical condition due to a COVID-19 vaccine mandate or mask mandate.

Effective: Upon passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning civil procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

11	mutated form of severe acute respiratory syndrome
12	coronavirus 2; or
13	(B) the disease caused by severe acute respiratory
14	syndrome coronavirus 2 or a mutated form of severe acute
15	respiratory syndrome coronavirus.
16	(2) "COVID-19 vaccine mandate" means a policy that
17	imposes an adverse consequence (including an adverse



1	employment action, a fine, or denial of access to services,
2	transportation, events, housing, hotels, or venues) against an
2 3	individual who refuses to be vaccinated against COVID-19,
4	even if the policy grants exemptions to certain individuals.
5	However, the term does not include a policy required by
6	federal law.
7	(3) "Mask mandate" means a policy that imposes an adverse
8	consequence (including an adverse employment action, a fine,
9	or denial of access to services, transportation, events, housing,
10	hotels, or venues) against an individual who refuses to wear a
11	mask on his or her face to prevent the spread of COVID-19,
12	even if the policy grants exemptions to certain individuals.
13	However, the term does not include a policy required by
14	federal law.
15	Chapter 2. Adverse Medical Condition Due to a COVID-19
16	Vaccine Mandate or Mask Mandate Action
17	Sec. 1. A person who subjects an individual to a COVID-19
18	vaccine mandate or a mask mandate is subject to liability for
19	physical harm caused by the mandate if the individual has
20	experienced an adverse medical condition due to being required to
21	comply with the mandate.
22	Chapter 3. Damages
23	Sec. 1. An individual who prevails in an action brought under
24	this article may:
25	(1) seek injunctive relief; and
26	(2) recover economic and noneconomic damages proximately
27	caused by the person's mandate, including damages to cover
28	medical expenses and lost wages.
29	SECTION 2. IC 34-30-32-1, AS ADDED BY P.L.1-2021,
30	SECTION 7, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
31	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 1. (a) This chapter applies only to a tort
32	action.
33	(b) This chapter applies to a cause of action that accrues on or after
34	March 1, 2020.
35	(c) This chapter does not apply to a cause of action under
