# SENATE BILL No. 219

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 16-36-6.

**Synopsis:** Physician order for scope of treatment. Requires an individual's treating physician to evaluate an individual's mental capacity before a physician order for scope of treatment (POST) form may be executed. Specifies that the first POST form executed by an individual is effective for six months but may be renewed with no expiration.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

(b) A POST form may be renewed and, upon renewal, does not expire unless revoked.
