DIGEST OF SB 221 (Updated March 21, 2023 11:39 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Energy audit of state government campus. Provides that the Indiana department of administration may issue a request for proposals and award a contract for the conduct of an energy audit on the: (1) Indiana state capitol building; and (2) Indiana government center north and south buildings; not later than December 31, 2023.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning utilities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

14 under IC 5-22-9 for the conduct of an energy audit on the buildings

16 (c) This SECTION expires January 1, 2024.
