DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-17.2-2-15.

Synopsis: CCDF copayments waiver. Requires, during the federally declared public health emergency concerning COVID-19, the division of family resources to continue to temporarily waive a family's copayment for participation in the federal Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) voucher program and make the payments to the child care program provider in the same manner as the division was waiving the copayment and making the payments to providers on January 1, 2022.

Effective: Upon passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

3	[EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 15. (a) This section applies:

5	concerning COVID-19 (as defined in IC 16-39-11-1) issued or
6	renewed by the Secretary of the United States Department of
7	Health and Human Services; and
8	(2) for sixty (60) days following the expiration or termination
9	of the federally declared public health emergency described
0	in subdivision (1) if the public health emergency is not
1	renewed or otherwise continued.
2	(b) The division shall:
3	(1) waive a family's copayment for participation in the federa
4	Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) voucher program
5	for a child of the family's early care and education; and
6	(2) make the copayment to the child care program provider
7	receiving the family's voucher;



1	in the same manner as the copayment was being waived and paid
2	to the provider by the division on January 1, 2022.
3	(c) The division shall provide families receiving the waiver
4	described in this section with at least sixty (60) days written notice
5	before the division may cease:
6	(1) waiving the family's copayments; and
7	(2) making the copayments to providers;
8	described in subsection (b).
9	(d) This section expires ninety (90) days after the termination of
10	the federally declared public health emergency described in
11	subsection (a).
12	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
