

## SENATE BILL No. 230

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### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 20-20-8.

**Synopsis:** School corporation reports. Requires certain additional information to be reported on a school corporation's annual performance report (report). Requires a school corporation to make the report available on the school corporation's Internet web site. (Current law provides that a school corporation may make the report available on its Internet web site.) Requires the school corporation to conduct a public hearing within 60 days after publication of the report. (Current law provides that a school corporation may conduct a public hearing within 60 days of publication of the report.)

**Effective:** July 1, 2015.

## SENATE BILL No. 230



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-20-8-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.43-2014,  
2 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
3 JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 3. (a) Not earlier than March 15 or later than  
4 March 31 of each year, The governing body of a school corporation  
5 shall publish an annual performance report of the school corporation,  
6 in compliance with the procedures identified in section 7 of this  
7 chapter. The report must be published one (1) time annually under  
8 IC 5-3-1.  
9 (b) The department shall make each school corporation's report  
10 available on the department's Internet web site. The annual  
11 performance report published on the Internet for a school corporation,  
12 including a charter school, must include any additional information  
13 submitted by the school corporation under section 6(3)(A) of this  
14 chapter. The governing body of a school corporation ~~may~~ **shall** make  
15 the school corporation's report available on the **main page of a** school  
16 corporation's Internet web site.



1 (c) The governing body of a school corporation shall provide a copy  
 2 of the report to a person who requests a copy. The governing body may  
 3 not charge a fee for providing the copy.

4 SECTION 2. IC 20-20-8-4, AS ADDED BY P.L.1-2005, SECTION  
 5 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,  
 6 2015]: Sec. 4. Not later than sixty (60) days after the publication of the  
 7 report, the governing body of a school corporation ~~may~~ **shall** conduct  
 8 a public hearing at a location within the school corporation to present  
 9 and discuss the report. The governing body may conduct the meeting  
 10 in conjunction with a regular meeting of the governing body.

11 SECTION 3. IC 20-20-8-8, AS AMENDED BY P.L.246-2013,  
 12 SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
 13 JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 8. The report must include the following  
 14 information:

15 (1) Student enrollment.

16 (2) Graduation rate (as defined in IC 20-26-13-6) **and the**  
 17 **graduation rate excluding students that receive a graduation**  
 18 **waiver under IC 20-32-4-4. The information must be provided**  
 19 **disaggregated by percentage of students by race, grade,**  
 20 **gender, socioeconomic status, and eligibility for special**  
 21 **education.**

22 (3) Attendance rate. **The information must be provided**  
 23 **disaggregated by percentage of students by race, grade,**  
 24 **gender, socioeconomic status, and eligibility for special**  
 25 **education.**

26 (4) The following test scores, including the number and  
 27 percentage of students meeting academic standards:

28 (A) ISTEP program test scores, **including end of course**  
 29 **assessment scores.**

30 (B) Scores for assessments under IC 20-32-5-21, if  
 31 appropriate.

32 (C) For a freeway school, scores on a locally adopted  
 33 assessment program, if appropriate.

34 **The information must be provided disaggregated by**  
 35 **percentage of students by race, grade, gender, socioeconomic**  
 36 **status, and eligibility for special education.**

37 **(5) School's performance category or designation of school**  
 38 **improvement assigned under IC 20-31-8.**

39 ~~(5)~~ **(6)** Average class size.

40 ~~(6)~~ **(7)** The number and percentage of students in the following  
 41 groups or programs:

42 (A) Alternative education, if offered.

 12 (A) For advanced placement tests, the percentage of students:  
 13 (i) scoring three (3), four (4), and five (5); and  
 14 (ii) taking the test.  
 15 (B) For the Scholastic Aptitude Test:  
 16 (i) test scores for all students taking the test;  
 17 (ii) test scores for students completing the academic honors  
 18 diploma program; and  
 19 (iii) the percentage of students taking the test.  
 20 ~~(8)~~ **(9)** Course completion, including the number and percentage  
 21 of students completing the following programs:  
 22 (A) Academic honors diploma.  
 23 (B) Core 40 curriculum.  
 24 (C) Career and technical programs.  
 25 ~~(9)~~ **(10)** The percentage of grade 8 students enrolled in algebra I.  
 26 **(11) The percentage of graduates considered college and**  
 27 **career ready in a manner prescribed by the state board.**  
 28 ~~(10)~~ **(12)** The percentage of graduates who pursue higher  
 29 education.  
 30 ~~(11)~~ **(13)** School safety, including:  
 31 (A) the number of students receiving suspension or expulsion  
 32 for the possession of alcohol, drugs, or weapons;  
 33 (B) the number of incidents reported under IC 20-33-9; and  
 34 (C) the number of bullying incidents reported under  
 35 IC 20-34-6 by category.  
 36 ~~(12)~~ **(14)** Financial information and various school cost factors,  
 37 including the following:  
 38 (A) Expenditures per pupil.  
 39 (B) Average teacher salary.  
 40 (C) Remediation funding.  
 41 **(D) Total expenses in relation to total revenue, including all**  
 42 **local, state, and federal funding.**



- 1 (E) A table of budgeted versus actual expenses by revenue  
 2 source, including the percentage of actual expense spent on  
 3 teachers, aides, and paraprofessionals.
- 4 (F) Total number of full-time employees, including the  
 5 percentage of full-time employees located in schools and  
 6 the percentage of full-time employees located at the school  
 7 corporation's administrative offices.
- 8 (G) List of all outstanding contracts that require the school  
 9 corporation to pay an amount exceeding one hundred  
 10 thousand dollars (\$100,000) and the corresponding  
 11 amounts.
- 12 (H) Building utilization information, including the  
 13 following:
- 14 (i) The number of students each building the school  
 15 corporation owns can serve.
- 16 (ii) The number of students being served in each building  
 17 owned by the school corporation.
- 18 (iii) The utilization percentage of each building owned by  
 19 each school corporation, calculated by dividing item (ii)  
 20 by item (i).
- 21 (I) The annual cost of utilities for each building the school  
 22 corporation owns divided by the square feet of the  
 23 building.
- 24 ~~(13)~~ (15) Technology accessibility and use of technology in  
 25 instruction.
- 26 ~~(14)~~ (16) Interdistrict and intradistrict student mobility rates, if  
 27 that information is available.
- 28 ~~(15)~~ (17) The number and percentage of each of the following  
 29 within the school corporation:
- 30 (A) Teachers who are certificated employees (as defined in  
 31 IC 20-29-2-4).
- 32 (B) Teachers who teach the subject area for which the teacher  
 33 is certified and holds a license.
- 34 (C) Teachers with national board certification.
- 35 ~~(16)~~ (18) The percentage of grade 3 students reading at grade 3  
 36 level (IREAD-3). The information must be provided  
 37 disaggregated by percentage of students by race, grade,  
 38 gender, socioeconomic status, and eligibility for special  
 39 education.
- 40 ~~(17)~~ (19) The number of students expelled, including the number  
 41 participating in other recognized education programs during their  
 42 expulsion, including the percentage of students expelled by



- 1           **race and the percentage of students expelled who are eligible**  
 2           **for free or reduced price lunch.**  
 3           ~~(18)~~ **(20)** Chronic absenteeism, which includes the number of  
 4           students who have been absent from school for ten percent (10%)  
 5           or more of a school year for any reason.  
 6           ~~(19)~~ **(21)** Habitual truancy, which includes the number of students  
 7           who have been absent ten (10) days or more from school within  
 8           a school year without being excused or without being absent  
 9           under a parental request that has been filed with the school.  
 10          ~~(20)~~ **(22)** The number of students who have dropped out of  
 11          school, including the reasons for dropping out, **including the**  
 12          **percentage of students who dropped out of school by race or**  
 13          **who are eligible for free or reduced price lunch.**  
 14          **(23) The number of out-of-school suspensions assigned,**  
 15          **including the percentage of students suspended by race and**  
 16          **the percentage of students expelled who are eligible for free or**  
 17          **reduced price lunch.**  
 18          **(24) The number of in-school suspensions assign, including the**  
 19          **percentage of students who received in-school suspensions by**  
 20          **race and the percentage of student who received in-school**  
 21          **suspensions who are eligible for free or reduced price lunch.**  
 22          ~~(21)~~ **(25)** The number of student work permits revoked.  
 23          ~~(22)~~ **(26)** The number of student driver's licenses revoked.  
 24          ~~(23)~~ **(27)** The number of students who have not advanced to grade  
 25          10 due to a lack of completed credits.  
 26          ~~(24)~~ **(28)** The number of students suspended for any reason.  
 27          ~~(25)~~ **(29)** The number of students receiving an international  
 28          baccalaureate diploma.  
 29          ~~(26)~~ **(30)** Other indicators of performance as recommended by the  
 30          education roundtable under IC 20-19-4.
