

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 233

DIGEST OF SB 233 (Updated February 13, 2024 9:16 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 12-21.

Synopsis: Certified community behavioral health clinics. Requires the office of the secretary of family and social services and the division of mental health and addiction to include each community mental health center that meets certain requirements in: (1) the community mental health services demonstration program (program), if Indiana is approved to participate in the program and as a state plan amendment for specified reimbursement after the program; or (2) if Indiana is not approved to participate in the program, a Medicaid state plan amendment or waiver to allow for Medicaid reimbursement for eligible certified community behavioral health clinic services by certain Medicaid providers.

Effective: July 1, 2024.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 233

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 12-21-2-3.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE

2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2024]: Sec. 3.5. (a) This subsection applies if the federal
4	government selects the state of Indiana to participate in the
5	community mental health services demonstration program
6	described in IC 12-15-1.3-25(f). The office of the secretary and the
7	division shall include each community mental health center that is
8	able to meet all federal and state requirements concerning
9	programming and data reporting:
10	(1) before July 1, 2027, as a part of the community mental
11	health services demonstration program; or
12	(2) beginning July 1, 2027, as part of a state plan amendment
13	requiring Medicaid reimbursement for Medicaid eligible
14	certified community behavioral health clinic services upon the
15	completion of the demonstration program described in
16	subdivision (1).
17	(b) This subsection applies if the federal government does not



select the state of Indiana to participate in the community mental 1 2 health services demonstration program described in 3 IC 12-15-1.3-25(f). Before July 1, 2025, the office of the secretary 4 and the division shall apply for a Medicaid state plan amendment 5 or a Medicaid waiver requiring Medicaid reimbursement for 6 Medicaid eligible certified community behavioral health clinic 7 services provided by a Medicaid behavioral health professional, 8 including each community mental health center and a behavioral 9 health professional authorized to provide Medicaid services and 10 employed by a community mental health center or a certified 11 community behavioral health clinic.
