# **SENATE BILL No. 240**

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

#### Citations Affected: IC 20-20-44.

**Synopsis:** Indiana school counseling pilot program. Establishes the Indiana school counseling pilot program, which authorizes the state superintendent of public instruction to select school corporations and charter schools from urban, suburban, and rural areas to apply for and receive grants from the department of education (department) to develop and implement school counseling programs. Establishes a fund, administered by the department, to provide grants to participating schools and to carry out or contract for research concerning school counseling programs. Makes an appropriation.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education and to make an appropriation.

#### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

The department shall determine the manner and the 20 amount of the grants awarded under this chapter. 21 Sec. 6. (a) The state superintendent shall select three (3) school 22 corporations and two (2) charter schools to participate in the pilot 23 program. 24 (b) The state superintendent shall seek to attain geographic 25 balance by selecting participating schools from urban, suburban, 26 and rural areas. 27 (c) If a school is selected to participate in the pilot program, the 28 department shall provide to the participating school a grant to do 29 the following: 30 (1) Develop and implement school counseling programs to 31 ensure that all students receive appropriate counseling 32 services. 33 (2) Document and address student outcomes. 34 Sec. 7. Participating schools must have at least one (1) licensed 35 school counselor to be eligible to receive a grant. 36 Sec. 8. The department shall use money in the fund to carry out 37 or contract for research in developing programs to assist school 38 counselor programs. 39 Sec. 9. (a) The department shall monitor the compliance of 40 participating schools with the requirements of the pilot program 41 as established by the department. 42 (b) The department shall determine the extent to which the

35 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2018;

39 from the state general fund for the department of education's use
40 in carrying out the purposes of the Indiana school counseling pilot

42 (b) This SECTION expires June 30, 2019.
