# **SENATE BILL No. 242**

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-1-9.5-8; IC 25-24-1-1.5.

**Synopsis:** Telemedicine and medical devices. Removes the restriction on the prescribing of ophthalmic devices through telemedicine and sets conditions on when a provider may, through telemedicine, prescribe medical devices. Prohibits the Indiana optometry board from setting standards for the practice of ocular telemedicine or ocular telehealth that are more restrictive than the standards established for in person practice.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

# **SENATE BILL No. 242**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-1-9.5-8, AS AMENDED BY P.L.150-2017,
2	SECTION 7, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 8. (a) A prescriber may issue a prescription to a
4	patient who is receiving services through the use of telemedicine if the
5	patient has not been examined previously by the prescriber in person
6	if the following conditions are met:
7	(1) The prescriber has satisfied the applicable standard of care in
8	the treatment of the patient.
9	(2) The issuance of the prescription by the prescriber is within the
10	prescriber's scope of practice and certification.
11	(3) The prescription:
12	(A) meets the requirements of subsection (b); and
13	(B) is not for an opioid. However, an opioid may be prescribed
14	if the opioid is a partial agonist that is used to treat or manage
15	opioid dependence.
16	(4) The prescription is not for an abortion inducing drug (as
17	defined in IC 16-18-2-1.6).



1	(5) The prescription is not for an ophthalmic device, including:
2	(b) The prescription is not for an opininaline device, including. (A) glasses;
3	(B) contact lenses; or
4	(C) low vision devices.
5	(5) If the prescription is for a medical device, including an
6	ophthalmic device, the provider must use telemedicine
7	technology that is sufficient to allow the provider to make an
8	informed diagnosis and treatment plan that includes the
9	medical device being prescribed.
10	(b) Except as provided in subsection (a), a prescriber may issue a
11	prescription for a controlled substance (as defined in IC 35-48-1-9) to
12	a patient who is receiving services through the use of telemedicine,
13	even if the patient has not been examined previously by the prescriber
14	in person, if the following conditions are met:
15	(1) The prescriber maintains a valid controlled substance
16	registration under IC 35-48-3.
17	(2) The prescriber meets the conditions set forth in 21 U.S.C. 829
18	et seq.
19	(3) The patient has been examined in person by a licensed Indiana
20	health care provider and the licensed health care provider has
21	established a treatment plan to assist the prescriber in the
22	diagnosis of the patient.
23	(4) The prescriber has reviewed and approved the treatment plan
24	described in subdivision (3) and is prescribing for the patient
25	pursuant to the treatment plan.
26	(5) The prescriber complies with the requirements of the
27	INSPECT program (IC 35-48-7).
28	(c) A prescription for a controlled substance under this section must
29	be prescribed and dispensed in accordance with IC 35-48-7.
30	SECTION 2. IC 25-24-1-1.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
31	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
32	1, 2019]: Sec. 1.5. The board may not establish standards
33	concerning the practice of ocular telemedicine or ocular telehealth
34	that are more restrictive than the standards that are set under this
35	article or by administrative rule and applicable to the
36	practitioner's in person ocular practice.
