A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

13	(b) A qualified individual is entitled to reduced fee hunting and
14	fishing licenses under this section.
15	(c) Each year a qualified individual may obtain:

1	(A) a resident yearly license to fish; and
2	(B) a resident yearly license to hunt; or
3	(2) a resident yearly license to hunt and fish;
4	by paying a reduced license fee of two dollars and seventy-five cents
5	(\$2.75) instead of the fee prescribed by section 1 of this chapter.
6	(d) Each decade a qualified individual may obtain:
7	(1) both:
8	(A) a resident license to fish that is valid for ten (10) years
9	and
10	(B) a resident license to hunt that is valid for ten (10) years; or
11	(2) a resident license to hunt and fish that is valid for ten (10)
12	years;
13	by paying a reduced license fee of twenty-seven dollars and fifty cents
14	(\$27.50).
15	(e) A qualified individual may obtain a lifetime license to hunt
16	fish, and trap by paying a reduced license fee of twenty dollars
17	(\$20).
18	(e) (f) An applicant for a reduced fee license under this section mus
19	do the following:
20	(1) Request the license from:
21	(A) the department;
22	(B) an agent appointed by the director under IC 14-22-11-3; or
23	(C) the clerk of the circuit court who is an authorized

30	under subsection (b), the department may issue to residents of Indiana
31	lifetime licenses to hunt, fish, or trap.
32	(b) The commission may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 and
33	IC 14-10-2-4 to establish fees for lifetime licenses to hunt, fish, or trap
