SENATE ENROLLED ACT No. 260

AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 25-1-5-4.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2022]: **Sec. 4.5.** (a) The agency's duties and functions under this chapter include developing and maintaining a system that allows an individual who is applying for:

- (1) an initial license or certificate; or
- (2) the renewal of an existing license or certificate; to become a donor of an anatomical gift (as defined by IC 29-2-16.1-1(3)).
- (b) The agency shall place the information of an individual who elects to become a donor of an anatomical gift in a donor registry (as defined by IC 29-2-16.1-1(9)).
- (c) An individual authorized to make an anatomical gift under IC 29-2-16.1 may amend or revoke an anatomical gift under IC 29-2-16.1-5. However, the agency's system under subsection (a) is not required to amend or remove a donor's decision to make an anatomical gift from the registry if the individual at a later time amends or revokes their decision to be a donor.
- (d) The system developed under this section must comply with the requirements under IC 29-2-16.1.

SECTION 2. IC 25-1-6-4.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE



AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 4.5. (a) The licensing agency's duties and functions under this chapter include developing and maintaining a system that allows an individual who is applying for:

- (1) an initial license or certificate; or
- (2) the renewal of an existing license or certificate; to become a donor of an anatomical gift (as defined by IC 29-2-16.1-1(3)).
- (b) The licensing agency shall place the information of an individual who elects to become a donor of an anatomical gift in a donor registry (as defined by IC 29-2-16.1-1(9)).
- (c) An individual authorized to make an anatomical gift under IC 29-2-16.1 may amend or revoke an anatomical gift under IC 29-2-16.1-5. However, the licensing agency's system under subsection (a) is not required to amend or remove a donor's decision to make an anatomical gift from the registry if the individual at a later time amends or revokes their decision to be a donor.
- (d) The system developed under this section must comply with the requirements under IC 29-2-16.1.

SECTION 3. IC 29-2-16.1-19, AS AMENDED BY P.L.11-2020, SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 19. (a) The bureau of motor vehicles, **the professional licensing agency**, and the department of natural resources shall cooperate with a person that administers any donor registry that this state establishes, contracts for, or recognizes for the purpose of transferring to the donor registry all relevant information regarding a donor's making, amendment to, or revocation of an anatomical gift.

- (b) A donor registry must:
 - (1) allow a donor or other person authorized under section 4 of this chapter to include on the donor registry a statement or symbol that the donor has made, amended, or revoked an anatomical gift;
 - (2) be accessible to a procurement organization and to coroners to allow it to obtain relevant information on the donor registry to determine, at or near death of the donor or a prospective donor, whether the donor or prospective donor has made, amended, or revoked an anatomical gift; and
 - (3) be accessible for purposes of subdivisions (1) and (2) seven
 - (7) days a week on a twenty-four (24) hour basis.
- (c) Personally identifiable information on a donor registry about a donor or prospective donor may not be used or disclosed without the express consent of the donor, prospective donor, or person that made



the anatomical gift for any purpose other than to determine, at or near death of the donor or prospective donor, whether the donor or prospective donor has made, amended, or revoked an anatomical gift.

(d) This section does not prohibit any person from creating or maintaining a donor registry that is not established by or under contract with the state. Any such registry must comply with subsections (b) and (c).
