Synopsis: Opioid addiction recovery. Changes the opioid addiction recovery pilot program for pregnant women and women with newborns into a permanent program. Makes an appropriation.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 16-35-10-1, AS ADDED BY P.L.174-2017
SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1,2019]: Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "pilot" program" means
the opioid addiction recovery pilot program for pregnant women and
women with newborns established by section 2 of this chapter.

SECTION 2. IC 16-35-10-2, AS ADDED BY P.L.174-2017, SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 2. Subject to the approval of the Indiana commission to combat drug abuse, The opioid addiction recovery pilot program for pregnant women and women with newborns is established to assist pregnant women and women with newborns by providing substance abuse and addiction treatment in a residential care facility and providing home visitation services.

SECTION 3. IC 16-35-10-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.174-2017, SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 3. To be eligible for participation in the pilot program, a woman must:

- (b) There is appropriated to the state department of health from the state general fund one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for the purpose of administering the opioid addiction recovery program for pregnant women and women with newborns established by IC 16-35-10-2, as amended by this act, for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.
 - (c) This SECTION expires July 1, 2022.
