# **SENATE BILL No. 275**

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 16-18-2; IC 16-20-10.

**Synopsis:** Public health medication. Allows certain local health department employees to administer or dispense public health medication under the standing order of a local health officer.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

7	Sec. 2. Notwithstanding any other law, the following employees
8	of a local health department may dispense, as part of the
9	employee's employment, a public health medication under the

12	(2) A licensed practical nurse (as defined in IC 25-23-1-1.2).
13	(3) A disease intervention specialist.
14	Sec. 3. Notwithstanding any other law, the following employees
15	of a local health department may administer a public health
16	medication under the standing order of a local health officer:
17	(1) A registered nurse licensed under IC 25-23.
18	(2) A licensed practical nurse (as defined in IC 25-23-1-1.2).
19	Sec. 4. A standing order issued by a local health officer under
20	this chapter must include the following:
21	(1) The immunization or medication covered under the order.
22	(2) The appropriate procedures for administering or
23	dispensing the medication.
24	(3) The appropriate procedures to respond to an adverse
25	reaction to the medication, including any medication or
26	category of medication to be administered in the event of an
27	adverse reaction.
28	(4) The:
29	(A) signature of the local health officer, or the local health
30	officer's designee; and
31	(B) date the standing order is issued.
