## SENATE ENROLLED ACT No. 279

AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 16-18-2-1.8, AS ADDED BY P.L.121-2006, SECTION 20, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 1.8. "Additional forensic services", for purposes of IC 16-21-8, means the following:

- (1) Initial pregnancy and sexually transmitted disease testing related to an alleged sex crime.
- (2) Prophylactic medication related to pregnancy, pregnancy testing, or sexually transmitted disease testing. However, This subdivision does not include includes HIV prophylactic medication. that may be paid at the discretion of the victim services division of the Indiana criminal justice institute.
- (3) Alcohol and drug testing.
- (4) Syphilis testing up to ninety (90) days after an alleged sex crime.
- (5) Pregnancy testing up to thirty (30) days after an alleged sex crime.
- (6) Mental health counseling concerning problems directly related to an alleged sex crime.
