# **SENATE BILL No. 279**

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-38.1-3-1.

**Synopsis:** Equine teeth floating. Provides that an individual who performs only equine teeth floating services is exempt from the veterinary medicine licensing requirements after submitting to the Indiana board of veterinary medical examiners (board) two signed letters of recommendation from previous clients. Requires the board to issue a card that identifies the individual who has submitted the letters of recommendation as a person who is exempt from licensing but may engage in the practice of veterinary medicine only by performing equine teeth floating services.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

### SENATE BILL No. 279

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning agriculture and animals.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-38.1-3-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.112-2014,
2	SECTION 35, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 1. (a) A person may not practice veterinary
4	medicine in Indiana unless the person:
5	(1) is licensed as a veterinarian in Indiana; or
6	(2) holds a special permit issued by the board.
7	(b) The following persons are exempt from the licensing or special
8	permit requirements of this chapter:
9	(1) A veterinarian on the faculty of the School of Veterinary
10	Medicine at Purdue University performing regular duties, or a
11	veterinarian employed by the animal disease diagnostic laboratory
12	established by IC 21-46-3-1 performing regular duties.
13	(2) A veterinary medical officer serving in the United States
14	armed forces or veterinarian employed by a federal, state, or local
15	government agency performing veterinary medical services that
16	are within the scope of official duties and are performed during
17	the period of the person's service.



1	(3) An individual who is a regular student in an accredited college
2	of veterinary medicine performing duties or actions assigned by
3	the faculty of the School of Veterinary Medicine at Purdue
4	University or working under the direct supervision of a licensed
5	veterinarian.
6	(4) An extern.
7	(5) A veterinarian who is licensed and is a resident in another
8	state or country and consults with a veterinarian licensed under
9	this article.
10	(6) An owner or a contract operator of an animal or a regular
11	employee of the owner or a contract operator caring for and
12	treating an animal, except where the ownership of the animal was
13	transferred for purposes of circumventing this chapter.
14	(7) A guest lecturing or giving instructions or demonstrations at
15	the School of Veterinary Medicine at Purdue University, or
16	elsewhere, in connection with a continuing education program.
17	(8) An individual while engaged in bona fide scientific research
18	that:
19	(A) reasonably requires experimentation involving animals;
20	and
21	(B) is conducted in a facility or with a company that complies
22 23 24	with federal regulations regarding animal welfare.
23	(9) A graduate of a foreign college of veterinary medicine who is
24	in the process of obtaining an ECFVG certificate or a PAVE
25	certificate and who is under the direct supervision of:
26 27	(A) the faculty of the School of Veterinary Medicine at Purdue
	University; or
28	(B) a veterinarian licensed under this article.
29	(10) A veterinarian who is enrolled in a postgraduate instructional
30	program in an accredited college of veterinary medicine
31	performing duties or actions assigned by the faculty of the School
32	of Veterinary Medicine at Purdue University.
33	(11) A member in good standing of another licensed or regulated
34	profession within Indiana who:
35	(A) provides assistance requested by a veterinarian licensed
36	under this article;
37	(B) acts with the consent of the client;
38	(C) acts within a veterinarian-client-patient relationship; and
39	(D) acts under the direct or indirect supervision of the licensed
40	veterinarian.
41	(12) An individual who:
42	(A) has submitted to the board two (2) signed letters of



1	recommendation, each from a client who has previously
2	employed the individual to perform, and attests to the
3	individual's ability to perform, equine teeth floating; and
4	(B) engages in the practice of veterinary medicine only by
5	performing equine teeth floating services.
5	(c) Not more than ten (10) business days after receiving signed
7	letters of recommendation under subsection (b)(12)(A), the board

(c) Not more than ten (10) business days after receiving signed letters of recommendation under subsection (b)(12)(A), the board shall issue to the individual who has submitted the letters a card identifying the individual as a person who is exempt from licensing under this article but may engage in the practice of veterinary medicine only by performing equine teeth floating services.
