### **SENATE BILL No. 285**

DIGEST OF SB 285 (Updated February 22, 2017 1:44 pm - DI 87)

Citations Affected: IC 36-8.

**Synopsis:** Mass traffic obstruction. Provides that the state police department may assist local law enforcement agencies in ensuring that public streets are open for use by emergency personnel. Makes it a Class C infraction for a person who is a member of an unlawful assembly to commit mass traffic obstruction.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

## **SENATE BILL No. 285**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 36-8-24 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2017]:
4	Chapter 24. Duty to Clear Roads
5	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "mass traffic obstruction" means
6	an incident in which, as part of (or as the result of) a protest, riot,
7	or other assembly, at least ten (10) persons obstruct vehicular
8	traffic in violation of IC 35-44.1-2-13 (obstruction of traffic).
9	Sec. 2. Every law enforcement agency has the duty to protect the
10	public, including persons engaged in lawful protest, by ensuring
11	that public streets remain open, unobstructed, and clear for use by
12	emergency vehicles and personnel responding to an emergency.
13	Sec. 3. In order to ensure that public streets remain open for use
14	by emergency personnel, the state police department may exercise
15	its jurisdiction under IC 10-11-2-21 to assist the local law
16	enforcement agency.
17	Sec. 4. A person who, being a member of an unlawful assembly



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- 1 involving mass traffic obstruction:
- 2 (1) engages in tumultuous conduct;
- 3 (2) obstructs traffic; or

4

- (3) fails to obey a lawful order to clear a public street;
- 5 commits mass traffic obstruction, a Class C infraction.



#### COMMITTEE REPORT

Madam President: The Senate Committee on Local Government, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 285, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

Page 1, line 5, delete "The following definitions apply throughout" and insert "**As used in**".

Page 1, line 5, delete ":" and insert ", "mass".

Page 1, line 6, delete "(1) "Mass".

Page 1, run in lines 5 through 6.

Page 1, delete lines 10 through 17, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"Sec. 2. Every law enforcement agency has the duty to protect the public, including persons engaged in lawful protest, by ensuring that public streets remain open, unobstructed, and clear for use by emergency vehicles and personnel responding to an emergency.

Sec. 3. In order to ensure that public streets remain open for use by emergency personnel, the state police department may exercise its jurisdiction under IC 10-11-2-21 to assist the local law enforcement agency.

Sec. 4. A person who, being a member of an unlawful assembly involving mass traffic obstruction:

(1) engages in tumultuous conduct;

(2) obstructs traffic; or

(3) fails to obey a lawful order to clear a public street;

commits mass traffic obstruction, a Class C infraction.".

Delete page 2.
