DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-7-2-178.9; IC 12-14-31.

Synopsis: Food stamp assistance after drug conviction. Allows certain individuals who were convicted of a drug offense but have not been convicted of another drug offense in the previous five years before applying for food stamps to receive food stamps. Permits individuals who have had a conviction in the last five years but who are receiving specified treatment and drug and alcohol testing to receive food stamps.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

5	(1) was convicted of an offense under IC 35-48 (controlled
6	substances), or an offense in another jurisdiction that is
