DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 4-32.2-2.

Synopsis: Electronic pull tabs in charity gaming. Allows the use of electronic pull tabs under the charity gaming law by: (1) adding a definition of "electronic pull tab device"; and (2) amending the definition of "pull tab" to include electronic versions of pull tab games.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning gaming.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
