ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 301

DIGEST OF SB 301 (Updated February 15, 2022 11:26 am - DI 141)

Citations Affected: IC 16-41.

Synopsis: Wastewater holding tanks in RV campgrounds. Provides that a recreational vehicle campground that is not connected to a public sewer system may include one or more holding tanks in which wastewater from recreational vehicles is stored before processing. Limits the capacity of a holding tank to not more than 10,000 gallons.

Effective: July 1, 2022.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 301

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 16-41-27.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2022]:
4	Chapter 27.5. Health, Sanitation, and Safety: Recreational
5	Vehicle Campgrounds
6	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "dependent RV campsite" means
7	an RV campsite that does not provide an individual sewer
8	connection for each recreational vehicle parked at the campsite.
9	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "independent RV campsite"
10	means an RV campsite that provides an individual sewer
11	connection for each recreational vehicle parked at the campsite.
12	Sec. 3. (a) As used in this chapter, "recreational vehicle" means
13	a vehicle with or without motive power that is equipped to be used
14	exclusively as living quarters for persons traveling upon the
15	highways.
16	(b) The term includes the following:
17	(1) A travel trailer, including a "fifth wheel" travel trailer

1	towed by a truck connected to the trailer by a hitch located in
2	the bed of the truck.
3	(2) A motor home.
4	(3) A truck camper that has an enclosure with a floor and
5	facilities allowing it to be used as a dwelling.
6	Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "RV campground" means an
7	area containing at least two (2) RV campsites.
8	Sec. 5. As used in this chapter, "RV campsite" means an
9	individual site at which at least one (1) recreational vehicle may be
10	parked overnight for vacation, recreational, health, educational,
11	sectarian, business, or tourist activities.
12	Sec. 6. As used in this chapter, "sanitary dumping station"
13	means a sewage inlet designed and intended for use in the disposal
14	of wastewater from the holding tanks of the recreational vehicles
15	using an RV campground.
16	Sec. 7. (a) This section applies to an RV campground that is not
17	connected to a public sewer system.
18	(b) This section applies to an RV campground:
19	(1) regardless of whether:
20	(A) all of the RV campsites in the RV campground are
21	independent RV campsites; or
22	(B) the RV campground includes:
23	(i) one (1) or more dependent RV campsites; and
24	(ii) one (1) or more sanitary dumping stations; and
25	(2) regardless of whether the RV campground is located in a
26	flood plain (as defined in IC 14-8-2-99).
27	(c) An RV campground may include one (1) or more holding
28	tanks to which wastewater from recreational vehicles is
29	transferred through one (1) or both of the following:
30	(1) The individual sewer connections of the RV campground's
31	independent RV campsites.
32	(2) One (1) or more sanitary dumping stations in the RV
33	campground.
34	A holding tank to which this subsection applies may have a
35	capacity of not more than ten thousand (10,000) gallons.
