SENATE BILL No. 302

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 21-39-8 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2018]:
4	Chapter 8. Campus Free Speech
5	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "free speech zone" means a
6	specific area of a state educational institution that is designated to
7	be a place where an individual may engage in free speech or
8	self-expression.
9	Sec. 2. (a) The board of trustees of each state educational
10	institution shall adopt policies that affirm the following principles
11	of free speech:
12	(1) A student should have the broadest latitude to speak,
13	write, listen, challenge, and learn.
14	(2) A state educational institution shall be a place where the
15	free exchange of ideas exists.
16	(3) A student, faculty member, or employee shall not obstruct
17	or interfere with the freedom of an individual to express the



1	individual's views.
2	(4) Free speech may not be restricted to a free speech zone.
3	(5) Spontaneous assemblies may not be subject to permitting
4	requirements of the state educational institution.
5	(6) Speakers invited to campus shall not be disinvited because
6	the speaker may be considered offensive by some individuals.
7	(b) The policies adopted under subsection (a) may permit
8	reasonable restrictions to prohibit an individual from disrupting
9	classes, guest speakers, graduation ceremonies, and other stated
10	educational institution events.
