DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-7-2; IC 12-15-2.7.

Synopsis: Medicaid long term services and supports. Requires: (1) the office of the secretary of family and social services; (2) an entity that has contracted with the office of the secretary; and (3) a person that has contracted with an entity; to contract with the area agencies on aging as the primary provider to perform specified long term services and supports programing for certain Medicaid applicants, enrollees, and recipients.

Effective: July 1, 2022.

Sec. 7. The office and the area agencies on aging shall enter into
an agreement concerning access to and the sharing of information
concerning Medicaid applicants, enrollees, and recipients that is
necessary for the area agencies on aging to perform the services set
forth in section 6 of this chapter.



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
