#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: Noncode.

**Synopsis:** Study of pharmacy deserts. Creates a task force to study pharmacy deserts in Indiana. Requires the task force to report findings and recommendations to the general assembly and the governor not later than November 1, 2023.

Effective: Upon passage.

# **SENATE BILL No. 319**

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) As used in this
2	SECTION, "task force" refers to the pharmacy desert prevention
3	task force established by subsection (c).
4	(b) As used in this SECTION, "pharmacy desert" means a
5	geographic area where access to a pharmacy (as defined in
6	IC 25-26-13-2) is limited, as determined by the state department of
7	health. The term includes a:
8	(1) rural town or urban neighborhood in which:
9	(A) at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the household
0	are below the federal income poverty level (as defined in
1	IC 12-15-2-1); or
2	(B) the median family income of residents is not more than
3	eighty percent (80%) of the median family income in
4	Indiana;
5	(2) rural town, urban neighborhood, or metropolitan census
6	tract in which at least:
7	(A) five hundred (500) residents reside; or
8	(B) thirty-three percent (33%) of the population resides;



1	more than one (1) mile away from any pharmacy; or
2	(3) nonmetropolitan census tract in which at least:
3	(A) five hundred (500) residents reside; or
4	(B) thirty-three percent (33%) of the population resides;
5	more than ten (10) miles away from any pharmacy.
6	(c) The pharmacy desert prevention task force is established.
7	(d) The task force consists of the following twenty (20) members
8	appointed by the governor:
9	(1) The commissioner of the state department of health or the
10	commissioner's designee.
11	(2) The secretary of family and social services or the
12	secretary's designee.
13	(3) One (1) member recommended by the president of the
14	Indiana board of pharmacy.
15	(4) One (1) member recommended by the board of the
16	Indiana Rural Health Association.
17	(5) One (1) member recommended by the chairperson of the
18	National Association of Chain Drug Stores.
19	(6) One (1) member recommended by the president of the
20	Indiana Pharmacists Association.
21	(7) One (1) member recommended by the chief executive
22	officer of Accelerate Indiana Municipalities.
23	(8) One (1) member recommended by the dean of the Purdue
24	University College of Pharmacy.
25	(9) One (1) member who represents a patient advocacy group
26	in Indiana.
27	(10) One (1) member who is a student enrolled in pharmacy
28	school, recommended by the Indiana Pharmacists Association
29	(11) One (1) member who is a licensed pharmacist and
30	employed by an independent pharmacy.
31	(12) Nine (9) members:
32	(A) each of whom is a licensed pharmacist;
33	(B) each of whom resides in a different congressional
34	district of Indiana; and
35	(C) not more than two (2) of whom may be employed by
36	the same employer.
37	(e) Not later than July 1, 2022, the governor shall appoint one
38	(1) member to serve as the chairperson of the task force and one (1)
39	member to serve as the vice chairperson of the task force.
40	(f) Not later than November 1, 2022, the chairperson shall call
41	the first meeting of the task force. Thereafter, the task force shall
42	meet at the call of the chairperson.



1	(g) A quorum of the task force consists of eleven (11) members.
2	The affirmative votes of at least eleven (11) members are necessary
3	for the task force to approve the final report and take any other
4	official action.
5	(h) The task force shall do the following:
6	(1) Identify pharmacy deserts in Indiana.
7	(2) Examine public and private programs in Indiana and
8	other states that address the problem of pharmacy deserts.
9	including programs that specifically address pharmacy
10	deserts in rural and urban areas.
11	(3) Identify programs and other solutions to eliminate
12	pharmacy deserts in Indiana, including public, private, and
13	public-private partnerships.
14	(4) Identify sources of revenue for pharmacy desert
15	programs.
16	(i) Each member of the task force who is not a state employee is
17	not entitled to the minimum salary per diem provided by
18	IC 4-10-11-2.1(b). The member is, however, entitled to
19	reimbursement for traveling expenses as provided under
20	IC 4-13-1-4 and other expenses actually incurred in connection
21	with the member's duties as provided in the state policies and
22	procedures established by the Indiana department of
23	administration and approved by the budget agency.
24	(j) Each member of the task force who is a state employee is
25	entitled to reimbursement for traveling expenses as provided under
26	IC 4-13-1-4 and other expenses actually incurred in connection
27	with the member's duties as provided in the state policies and
28	procedures established by the Indiana department of
29	administration and approved by the budget agency.
30	(k) The state department of health shall do the following:
31	(1) Staff and provide administrative assistance to the task
32	force.
33	(2) Pay the expenses of the task force from appropriations
34	made to the state department of health.
35	(l) Not later than November 1, 2023, the task force shall report
36	the task force's findings and recommendations to the general
37	assembly and the governor. The report to the general assembly
38	must be in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.

(m) This SECTION expires November 1, 2023. SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
