DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 35-46-10.

Synopsis: Prohibition on operating a drone while impaired. Provides that a person who operates an unmanned aerial vehicle while intoxicated commits the crime of operating an unmanned aerial vehicle while intoxicated, a Class B misdemeanor.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

0	(3) breaches the peace or is in imminent danger of breaching

2	(4) harasses, annoys, or alarms another person;
3	commits the crime of operating an unmanned aerial vehicle while
4	intoxicated, a Class B misdemeanor.
5	(b) A person may not initiate or maintain an action against a
6	law enforcement officer based on the officer's failure to enforce
7	this chapter.
