## SENATE BILL No. 337

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 10-10.5; IC 35-44.1-3-3.

**Synopsis:** Public safety matters. Defines "personally identifying information" and prohibits, after June 30, 2023, the broadcast of personally identifying information by police radio unless the broadcast is encrypted. Provides that a person who refuses to follow the lawful commands of a law enforcement officer while the officer is engaged in the officer's official duties commits a Class B misdemeanor.

Effective: July 1, 2022.

7	Sec. 1. After June 30, 2023, a law enforcement officer, a law

2	may not broadcast personally identifying information over a police

4	Sec. 2. Section 1 of this chapter does not prohibit the broadcast
5	or disclosure of personally identifying information other than:

9	conferences, silver or amber alerts, wanted notices, Internet web

14	JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 3. A person who, when ordered by a law
15	enforcement officer to:
16	(1) assist the officer; or
17	(2) follow the lawful commands of the officer;
18	while the officer is engaged in the execution of the officer's official
19	duties, knowingly or intentionally, and without a reasonable cause,
20	refuses to assist or follow the command commits refusal to aid an
21	officer, a Class B misdemeanor.
