DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 31-25-2-21.

Synopsis: Financial literacy for foster children. Requires a transitional services plan for foster children to include information about: (1) the healthy Indiana plan; (2) the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program; (3) the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program; (4) basic banking and account management; (5) student loan and grant application completion; and (6) individual development accounts.

Effective: July 1, 2021.
