# SENATE BILL No. 355

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 5-2-10.1-12; IC 20-19-3-11; IC 20-26-5-35.5; IC 20-30-5-5.7.

**Synopsis:** Child abuse education and policies. Requires, not later than July 1, 2018, the department of education (department) to make available model educational materials and model response policies and reporting procedures concerning child abuse and child sexual abuse to assist schools with the implementation of: (1) child abuse and child sexual abuse education programs in kindergarten through grade 12; and (2) child abuse and child sexual abuse response and reporting policies. (Current law requires the department to make available the model educational materials and model response policies and reporting procedures concerning child abuse and child sexual abuse to assist schools with the implementation of: (1) child abuse and child sexual abuse education programs in grades 2 through 5; and (2) child abuse and child sexual abuse response and reporting policies.) Requires that the: (1) materials and guidelines provided to assist a safe school committee in developing a plan and policy for a school include the model educational materials and the model response policies and reporting procedures; and (2) plan and policy developed by the safe school committee; must address the issues of child abuse and child sexual abuse. Requires a school corporation to: (1) adopt child abuse and child sexual abuse response and reporting policies; and (2) provide training to certain employees and volunteers concerning the child abuse and child sexual abuse response and reporting policies. Beginning in 2018, requires, not later than October 15 of each year, a public school to provide age appropriate, research and evidence based instruction on child abuse and child sexual abuse to students in kindergarten through grade 12.

### SENATE BILL No. 355

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:* 

SECTION 1. IC 5-2-10.1-12, AS AMENDED BY P.L.25-2016
SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 12. (a) Each school corporation shall establish a
safe school committee. The committee may be a subcommittee of the
committee that develops the strategic and continuous schoo
improvement and achievement plan under IC 20-31-5. Each committee
may include at least one (1) member who is a member of the suppor
staff of the school or school corporation career and technical education
school.

- (b) The department of education, the school corporation's school safety specialist, and, upon request, a school resource officer (as described in IC 20-26-18.2-1) shall provide materials and guidelines to assist a safe school committee in developing a plan and policy for the school that addresses the following issues:
  - (1) Unsafe conditions, crime prevention, school violence, bullying, criminal organization activity, **child abuse and child sexual abuse**, and other issues that prevent the maintenance of a

2 3	(2) Professional development needs for faculty and staff to
	implement methods that decrease problems identified under

5	(3) Methods to encourage:
6	(A) involvement by the community and students;
7	(B) development of relationships between students and school

10	(c) As a part of the plan developed under subsection (b), each safe
11	school committee shall provide a copy of the floor plans for each
12	building located on the school's property that clearly indicates each
13	exit, the interior rooms and hallways, and the location of any hazardous
14	materials located in the building to the law enforcement agency and the
15	fire department that have jurisdiction over the school.
16	(d) The guidelines developed under subsection (b) must include age
17	appropriate, research based information that assists school corporations
18	and safe school committees in:
19	(1) developing and implementing bullying prevention programs;
20	(2) establishing investigation and reporting procedures related to
21	bullying; and
22	(3) adopting discipline rules that comply with IC 20-33-8-13.5.
23	(e) In addition to developing guidelines under subsection (b), the
24	department of education shall establish categories of types of bullying
25	incidents to allow school corporations to use the categories in making
26	reports under IC 20-20-8-8 and IC 20-34-6-1.
27	(f) The materials and guidelines provided under subsection (b)
28	must include the model educational materials and model response
29	policies and reporting procedures on child abuse and child sexual
30	abuse developed or identified under IC 20-19-3-11.
31	SECTION 2. IC 20-19-3-11, AS AMENDED BY P.L.13-2013,
32	SECTION 54, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
33	JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 11. (a) The department, in collaboration with the
34	department of child services and organizations that have expertise in
35	child abuse, including child sexual abuse, shall identify or develop:
36	(1) research and evidence based model educational materials on
37	child abuse and child sexual abuse; and
38	(2) a model for child abuse and child sexual abuse response

- (b) A school corporation shall provide to the school corporation's employees and volunteers who have direct, ongoing contact with students training on the child abuse and child sexual abuse response and reporting policies adopted by the school corporation under subsection (a).
- SECTION 4. IC 20-30-5-5.7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 5.7. (a) Not later than October 15, 2018, and each October 15 thereafter, each public school shall provide age appropriate, research and evidence based instruction on child abuse and child sexual abuse to students in kindergarten through grade 12.
- (b) The department, in consultation with school safety specialists and school counselors, shall prepare outlines or materials for the instruction described in subsection (a) and incorporate the instruction in kindergarten through grade 12.
- (c) Instruction on child abuse and child sexual abuse may be delivered by a school safety specialist, school counselor, or any other person with training and expertise in the area of child abuse and child sexual abuse.
