SENATE BILL No. 356

DIGEST OF SB 356 (Updated February 5, 2015 10:23 am - DI 120)

Citations Affected: IC 20-32.

Synopsis: Work ethic certification and grants. Provides that a school corporation may establish a work ethic certification program under which a student who develops skills necessary for success in higher education or employment receives a work ethic certificate upon graduation. Provides that the state board of education may adopt rules to: (1) establish model criteria for a work ethic certification program; and (2) develop a standard work ethic certificate.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

SENATE BILL No. 356

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-32-10 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

4	Chapter 10. Work Ethic Certification
5	Sec. 1. Working with local employers, each school corporation
6	may develop a program in which students develop work ethic skills
7	necessary for success in higher education or employment, which
8	may include the following:
9	(1) Attendance and punctuality.
10	(2) Academic success.
11	(3) Organization and efficiency.
12	(4) Initiative.
13	(5) Respect for others.
14	(6) Persistence.
15	(7) Dependability.
16	(8) Teamwork.

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1 (9) Community service.

- 2 Sec. 2. A graduating student who successfully completes the 3 program shall be awarded a work ethic certificate.
 - Sec. 3. The state board may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2:
- 5 (1) establishing model criteria for work ethic certification
- 6 programs as a part of the state's college and career readiness
- 7 standards; and

8 (2) developing a standard work ethic certificate.
