DIGEST OF SB 375 (Updated January 18, 2018 2:11 pm - DI 132)

Citations Affected: IC 9-13; IC 9-17; IC 9-18.1.

Synopsis: Transport operator. Defines "disposable trailer". Requires the bureau of motor vehicles to issue a transport operator license plate to an operator of a tractor-mobile home rig or a special tractor-mobile home rig transporting a sectionalized building using a disposable trailer upon application for the license plates. Makes conforming changes.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

SENATE BILL No. 375

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 9-13-2-44.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2018]: Sec. 44.5. "Disposable trailer" means a trailer that is
4	designed for single use transportation of a sectionalized building
5	after which the parts of the trailer are disassembled to be sold or
6	recycled.
7	SECTION 2. IC 9-13-2-187, AS AMENDED BY P.L.149-2015,
8	SECTION 25, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
9	JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 187. "Transport operator" means any of the
10	following:
11	(1) An Indiana resident or business engaged in the business of
12	furnishing drivers and operators for the purpose of transporting
13	motor vehicles in transit from one (1) place to another by the
14	drive away or tow away methods.
15	(2) An Indiana dealer or manufacturer engaged in the operation
16	or business described in subdivision (1). An Indiana dealer
17	described in this subdivision must hold a valid Indiana dealer

1	license.
2	(3) An Indiana business that prepares newly purchased motor
3	vehicles of the business and delivers the motor vehicles to the
4	locations where the motor vehicles will be based, titled, and
5	registered.
6	(4) An operator of a tractor-mobile home rig or a special
7	tractor-mobile home rig transporting a sectionalized building
8	using a disposable trailer.
9	SECTION 3. IC 9-17-1-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.198-2016,
10	SECTION 199, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
11	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 1. (a) This article does not apply to
12	the following:
13	(1) A vehicle that is not required to be registered under IC 9-18-2
14	(before its expiration) or IC 9-18.1.
15	(2) Special machinery.
16	(3) A motor vehicle that was designed to have a maximum design (25)
17	speed of not more than twenty-five (25) miles per hour and that
18	was built, constructed, modified, or assembled by a person other
19	than the manufacturer.
20 21	(4) Motor driven cycles.
21 22	(5) An off-road vehicle that was purchased or otherwise acquired
22	before January 1, 2010. (6) Snowmobiles.

24 25	(7) A watercraft that is not required to be registered under IC 9-31-3.
23 26	(8) A disposable trailer.
20 27	(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), a person may apply for:

20 29	(1) a certificate of this under IC 9 17 2 2, of (2) a special identification number under IC 9-17-4;
30	for a vehicle listed in subsection (a).
31	(c) If the bureau issues a certificate of title under subsection (b)(1),
32	the vehicle remains subject to this article until the titleholder
33	surrenders the title to the bureau.
34	SECTION 4. IC 9-18.1-12-4, AS ADDED BY P.L.198-2016,

36	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 4. (a) This section does not apply
37	to a vehicle registered as a recovery vehicle under IC 9-18.1-6.
38	(b) A transport operator may, instead of registering each motor
39	vehicle transported or disposable trailer used, make a verified
40	application upon a form prescribed by the bureau and furnished by the
41	bureau for a general distinctive registration number for:
42	(1) all motor vehicles transported by the transport operator and

2	(2) all disposable trailers used and operated for the purpose

	(c) The application must contain the following:
5	(1) A brief description of:
6	(A) each style or type of motor vehicle transported; or
7	(B) the type of disposable trailer used to transport the
8	sectionalized building.
9	(2) The name and address, including the county of residence, of
10	the transport operator.
11	(3) For an application to use a disposable trailer, a statement
12	that the disposable trailer will be disassembled after a single
13	use.
14	(3) (4) Any other information the bureau requires.
15	(c) (d) The bureau, upon receiving:
16	(1) an application for a transport operator license plate; and
17	(2) the fee under subsection (i); (j);
18	shall issue to the person that submitted the application and fee two (2)
19	certificates of registration and the license plates with numbers
20	corresponding to the numbers of the certificates of registration. A
21	transport operator may obtain as many additional pairs of license plates
22	as desired upon application and the payment to the bureau of the fee
23	under subsection (k) (I) for each pair of additional license plates.
24	(d) (e) A license plate or sign other than those furnished and
25	approved by the bureau may not be used.
26	(e) (f) A transport operator license plate may not be used on a
27	vehicle used or operated on a highway, except for the purpose of
28	transporting:
29	(1) vehicles in transit; or
30	(2) sectionalized buildings.
31	A person may haul other vehicles or parts of vehicles in transit in the
32	same combination.
33	(f) (g) A transport operator may not operate a vehicle or any
34	combination of vehicles in excess of the size and weight limits
35	specified by law.
36	(g) (h) A license plate issued under this section shall be displayed
37	on the front and rear of each combination, and if only one (1) motor
38	vehicle is transported, a license plate shall be displayed on both the
39	front and rear of the motor vehicle.
40	(h) (i) The bureau may not issue transport operator license plates to
41	a transport operator that has been convicted of violating this section
42	until the bureau is satisfied that the transport operator is able to comply

1	with the requirements of this section.
2	(i) (j) The fee for one (1) set of license plates for each transport
3	operator is one hundred thirty-nine dollars and twenty-five cents
4	(\$139.25). The fee shall be distributed as follows:
5	(1) Twenty-five cents ((0.25)) to the state police building account.
6	(2) Five dollars (\$5) to the crossroads 2000 fund.
7	(3) Nine dollars (\$9) to the commission fund.
8	(4) Thirty dollars (\$30) to the highway, road and street fund.
9	(5) Ninety-five dollars (\$95) to the motor vehicle highway
10	account.
11	(j) (k) The fee for the first two (2) sets of license plates for each
12	transport operator is one hundred fifty-eight dollars and twenty-five
13	cents (\$158.25). The fee shall be distributed as follows:
14	(1) Twenty-five cents ((0.25)) to the state police building account.
15	(2) Fifteen dollars (\$15) to the crossroads 2000 fund.
16	(3) Eighteen dollars (\$18) to the commission fund.
17	(4) Thirty dollars (\$30) to the highway, road and street fund.
18	(5) Ninety-five dollars (\$95) to the motor vehicle highway
19	account.
20	(k) (l) The fee for each additional set of license plates for a transport
21	operator is thirty-four dollars and twenty-five cents (\$34.25). The fee
22	shall be distributed as follows:
23	(1) Twenty-five cents ((0.25)) to the state police building account.
24	(2) Nine dollars (\$9) to the commission fund.
25	(3) Ten dollars (\$10) to the crossroads 2000 fund.
26	(4) Fifteen dollars (\$15) to the motor vehicle highway account.
