

## **ENGROSSED** SENATE BILL No. 375

DIGEST OF SB 375 (Updated February 21, 2018 12:18 pm - DI 123)

Citations Affected: IC 9-13; IC 9-18.1.

**Synopsis:** Transport operator. Defines "disposable trailer". Requires the bureau of motor vehicles to issue a transport operator license plate to an operator of a tractor-mobile home rig or a special tractor-mobile home rig transporting a sectionalized building using a disposable trailer upon application for the license plates. Adds disposable trailers to a statutory list of vehicles that are not required to be registered. Makes conforming changes.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

# ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 375

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 9-13-2-44.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
AS A <b>NEW</b> SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
1, 2018]: Sec. 44.5. "Disposable trailer" means a trailer that is
designed for single use transportation of a sectionalized building
after which the parts of the trailer are disassembled to be sold or
recycled.
SECTION 2. IC 9-13-2-187, AS AMENDED BY P.L.149-2015,
SECTION 25, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 187. "Transport operator" means any of the
following:
(1) An Indiana resident or business engaged in the business of
furnishing drivers and operators for the purpose of transporting
motor vehicles in transit from one (1) place to another by the
drive away or tow away methods.
(2) An Indiana dealer or manufacturer engaged in the operation
or business described in subdivision (1). An Indiana dealer
described in this subdivision must hold a valid Indiana dealer

2	(3) An Indiana business that prepares newly purchased motor
3	vehicles of the business and delivers the motor vehicles to the
4	locations where the motor vehicles will be based, titled, and
5	registered.
6	(4) An operator of a tractor-mobile home rig or a special
7	tractor-mobile home rig transporting a sectionalized building
8	using a disposable trailer.
9	SECTION 3. IC 9-18.1-2-2, AS ADDED BY P.L.198-2016
10	SECTION 326, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
11	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 2. The following vehicles are no
12	required to be registered under this article:
13	(1) A vehicle that is propelled by electric power obtained from
14	overhead trolley wires but is not operated on rails or tracks.
15	(2) A firetruck and apparatus used for fire protection.
16	(3) A new motor vehicle if the new motor vehicle is being
17	operated in Indiana solely to remove it from an accident site to a
18	storage location because:
19	(A) the new motor vehicle was being transported on a railroad
20	car or semitrailer; and
21	(B) the railroad car or semitrailer was involved in an acciden
22	that required the unloading of the new motor vehicle to
23	preserve or prevent further damage to it.
24	(4) A vehicle that is:
25	(A) owned or leased; and
26	(B) used;
27	by the United States government for official governmen
28	purposes.
29	(5) A school bus or special purpose bus that is:
30	(A) owned by a school corporation; and
31	(B) registered under IC 20-27-7.
32	(6) Golf carts when operated in accordance with an ordinance
33	adopted under IC 9-21-1-3(a)(14) or IC 9-21-1-3.3(a).
34	(7) A vehicle that is not designed for or employed in genera
35	highway transportation of persons or property and is occasionally
36	operated or moved over the highway, including the following:
37	(A) An electric personal assistive mobility device.
38	(B) Road construction or maintenance machinery.
39	(C) A movable device designed, used, or maintained to aler
40	motorists of hazardous conditions on highways.
41	(D) Construction dust control machinery.
42	(E) A well boring apparatus.

2	(G) An implement of agriculture designed to be operated

14	SECTION 4. IC 9-18.1-12-4, AS ADDED BY P.L.198-2016,
15	SECTION 326, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
16	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 4. (a) This section does not apply
17	to a vehicle registered as a recovery vehicle under IC 9-18.1-6.
18	(b) A transport operator may, instead of registering each motor
19	vehicle transported or disposable trailer used, make a verified
20	application upon a form prescribed by the bureau and furnished by the
21	bureau for a general distinctive registration number for:
22	(1) all motor vehicles transported by the transport operator and
23	used and operated for the purposes provided; or
24	(2) all disposable trailers used and operated for the purpose
25	of transporting sectionalized buildings.
26	<b>(c)</b> The application must contain the following:
27	(1) A brief description of:
28	(A) each style or type of motor vehicle transported; or
29	(B) the type of disposable trailer used to transport the
30	sectionalized building.
31	(2) The name and address, including the county of residence, of
32	the transport operator.
33	(3) For an application to use a disposable trailer, a statement
34	that the disposable trailer will be disassembled after a single
35	use.
36	(3) (4) Any other information the bureau requires.
37	(c) (d) The bureau, upon receiving:
38	(1) an application for a transport operator license plate; and
39	(2) the fee under subsection (i); (j);
40	shall issue to the person that submitted the application and fee two (2)
41	certificates of registration and the license plates with numbers
42	corresponding to the numbers of the certificates of registration. A



1	transport operator may obtain as many additional pairs of license plates
2	as desired upon application and the payment to the bureau of the fee
3	under subsection (k) (l) for each pair of additional license plates.
4	(d) (e) A license plate or sign other than those furnished and
5	approved by the bureau may not be used.
6	(e) (f) A transport operator license plate may not be used on a
7	vehicle used or operated on a highway, except for the purpose of
8	transporting:
9	(1) vehicles in transit; or
10	(2) sectionalized buildings.
11	A person may haul other vehicles or parts of vehicles in transit in the
12	same combination.
13	(f) (g) A transport operator may not operate a vehicle or any
14	combination of vehicles in excess of the size and weight limits
15	specified by law.
16	(g) (h) A license plate issued under this section shall be displayed
17	on the front and rear of each combination, and if only one (1) motor
18	vehicle is transported, a license plate shall be displayed on both the
19	front and rear of the motor vehicle.
20	(h) (i) The bureau may not issue transport operator license plates to
21	a transport operator that has been convicted of violating this section
22	until the bureau is satisfied that the transport operator is able to comply
23	with the requirements of this section.
24	(i) (j) The fee for one (1) set of license plates for each transport
25	operator is one hundred thirty-nine dollars and twenty-five cents
26	(\$139.25). The fee shall be distributed as follows:
27	(1) Twenty-five cents (\$0.25) to the state police building account.
28	(2) Five dollars (\$5) to the crossroads 2000 fund.
29	(3) Nine dollars (\$9) to the commission fund.
30	(4) Thirty dollars (\$30) to the highway, road and street fund.
31	(5) Ninety-five dollars (\$95) to the motor vehicle highway
32	account.
33	(i) (k) The fee for the first two (2) sets of license plates for each
34	transport operator is one hundred fifty-eight dollars and twenty-five
35	cents (\$158.25). The fee shall be distributed as follows:
36	(1) Twenty-five cents (\$0.25) to the state police building account.
37	(2) Fifteen dollars (\$15) to the crossroads 2000 fund.
38	(3) Eighteen dollars (\$18) to the commission fund.
39	(4) Thirty dollars (\$30) to the highway, road and street fund.
40	(5) Ninety-five dollars (\$95) to the motor vehicle highway

Mr. Speaker: Your Committee on Roads and Transportation, to which was referred Senate Bill 375, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

Page 2, delete lines 9 through 33, begin a new paragraph and insert: "SECTION 3. IC 9-18.1-2-2, AS ADDED BY P.L.198-2016, SECTION 326, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 2. The following vehicles are not required to be registered under this article:

- (1) A vehicle that is propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires but is not operated on rails or tracks.
- (2) A firetruck and apparatus used for fire protection.
- (3) A new motor vehicle if the new motor vehicle is being operated in Indiana solely to remove it from an accident site to a storage location because:



- (A) the new motor vehicle was being transported on a railroad car or semitrailer; and
- (B) the railroad car or semitrailer was involved in an accident that required the unloading of the new motor vehicle to preserve or prevent further damage to it.
- (4) A vehicle that is:
  - (A) owned or leased; and
  - (B) used;
- by the United States government for official government purposes.
- (5) A school bus or special purpose bus that is:
  - (A) owned by a school corporation; and
  - (B) registered under IC 20-27-7.
- (6) Golf carts when operated in accordance with an ordinance adopted under IC 9-21-1-3(a)(14) or IC 9-21-1-3.3(a).
- (7) A vehicle that is not designed for or employed in general highway transportation of persons or property and is occasionally operated or moved over the highway, including the following:
  - (A) An electric personal assistive mobility device.
  - (B) Road construction or maintenance machinery.
  - (C) A movable device designed, used, or maintained to alert motorists of hazardous conditions on highways.
  - (D) Construction dust control machinery.
  - (E) A well boring apparatus.
  - (F) A ditch digging apparatus.
  - (G) An implement of agriculture designed to be operated primarily in a farm field or on farm premises.
  - (H) A farm tractor.
  - (I) A farm wagon.
  - (J) A tractor:
    - (i) that is used to move semitrailers around a terminal or a loading or spotting facility; and
    - (ii) for which a permit is issued under IC 6-6-4.1-13(f).



- (8) An off-road vehicle or a snowmobile.
- (9) A vehicle that is operated and displays a license plate in accordance with IC 9-32.
- (10) A disposable trailer.".

Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
