DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 9-24.

Synopsis: Autism information on state issued identification. Provides that an identifying symbol for a medical condition on a driver's license, permit, or identification card may also be used to indicate an autism spectrum disorder.

Effective: Upon passage; July 1, 2020; July 1, 2021.

SENATE BILL No. 379

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 9-24-9-2.3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.82-2019
2	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 2.3. (a) An application for a driver's license of
4	permit under this chapter must contain the following questions:
5	(1) "Have you served in the armed forces of the United States?"
6	(2) "Are you the surviving spouse of someone who served in the
7	armed forces of the United States or their reserves, in the National
8	Guard, or in the Indiana National Guard?".
9	(b) In addition to the questions set forth in subsection (a), ar
10	application for a driver's license or permit to be issued under this article
11	must enable the applicant to indicate the following:
12	(1) The applicant is a veteran and wishes to have an indication of
13	the applicant's veteran status appear on the driver's license or
14	permit.
15	(2) The applicant is the surviving spouse of a veteran of the armed
16	forces of the United States and wishes to have an indication of the
17	applicant's status as a surviving spouse of a veteran appear on the



1	license or permit.
2	(3) The applicant has a medical condition of note, including
3	autism (as defined in IC 12-11-8-1), and wishes to have an
4	identifying symbol and a brief description of the medical
5	condition appear on the driver's license or permit.
6	(c) The bureau shall keep in a data base and share the information
7	submitted under subsections (a) and (b)(2) upon request by the Indiana
8	department of veterans' affairs. The information submitted under
9	subsections (a) and (b)(2) may be used by the Indiana department of
10	veterans' affairs to develop outreach programs for veterans and their
11	families.
12	(d) The application for a driver's license or permit under this chapter
13	must indicate that an applicant has the option whether or not to answer
14	the questions set forth in subsection (a).

16	SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
17	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 5.5. (a) If an individual has:
18	(1) indicated on the application for a driver's license or learner's
19	permit that the individual is a veteran and wishes to have an
20	indication of the individual's veteran status appear on the driver's
21	license or learner's permit; and
22	(2) provided proof at the time of application of the individual's
23	veteran status;
24	an indication of the individual's veteran status shall be shown on the
25	driver's license or learner's permit.
26	(b) If an individual has:
27	(1) indicated on the individual's application for a driver's license
28	or learner's permit that the applicant:
29	(A) is a surviving spouse of a veteran; and
30	(B) wishes to have an indication of the applicant's status as a
31	surviving spouse of a veteran appear on the driver's license or
32	learner's permit; and
33	(2) provided the documentation necessary to verify that the
34	applicant was married, at the time of the decedent's death, to a
35	veteran;
36	an indication of the individual's status as a surviving spouse of a
37	veteran shall be shown on the driver's license or learner's permit.
38	(c) If an individual submits information concerning the individual's
39	medical condition, including autism (as defined in IC 12-11-8-1), in
40	conjunction with the individual's application for a driver's license or
41	learner's permit, the bureau shall place an identifying symbol on the
42	face of the driver's license or learner's permit to indicate that the



individual has a medical condition of note. The bureau shall include information on the individual's driver's license or learner's permit that briefly describes the individual's medical condition. The information must be printed in a manner that alerts an individual reading the driver's license or learner's permit to the existence of the medical condition. The individual submitting the information concerning the medical condition is responsible for its accuracy.

SECTION 3. IC 9-24-11-5.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.178-2019, SECTION 50, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 5.5. (a) If an individual has:

- (1) indicated on the application for a driver's license or learner's permit that the individual is a veteran and wishes to have an indication of the individual's veteran status appear on the driver's license or learner's permit; and
- (2) provided proof at the time of application of the individual's veteran status;

an indication of the individual's veteran status shall be shown on the driver's license or learner's permit.

(b) If an individual has:

- (1) indicated on the individual's application for a driver's license or learner's permit that the applicant:
 - (A) is a surviving spouse of a veteran; and
 - (B) wishes to have an indication of the applicant's status as a surviving spouse of a veteran appear on the driver's license or learner's permit; and
- (2) provided the documentation necessary to verify that the applicant was married, at the time of the decedent's death, to a veteran;

an indication of the individual's status as a surviving spouse of a veteran shall be shown on the driver's license or learner's permit.

(c) If an individual submits information concerning the individual's medical condition, **including autism (as defined in IC 12-11-8-1)**, in conjunction with the individual's application for a driver's license or learner's permit, the bureau shall place an identifying symbol in a prominent location on a driver's license or learner's permit to indicate that the individual has a medical condition of note. The bureau shall include information on the individual's driver's license or learner's permit that briefly describes the individual's medical condition. The information must be notated in a manner that alerts an individual reading the driver's license or learner's permit to the existence of the medical condition. The individual submitting the information concerning the medical condition is responsible for its accuracy.

 - (2) has a pending application for asylum in the United States;
 - (3) has a pending or approved application for temporary protected status in the United States;
 - (4) has approved deferred action status; or
 - (5) has a pending application for adjustment of status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States or conditional permanent residence status in the United States:

must be clearly identified as a temporary identification card. A temporary identification card issued under this subsection may not be renewed without the presentation of valid documentary evidence proving that the holder of the identification card's temporary status has been extended.

- (g) For purposes of subsection (b), an individual certified as a program participant in the address confidentiality program under IC 5-26.5 is not required to provide the address of the individual's principal residence, but may provide an address designated by the office of the attorney general under IC 5-26.5 as the address of the individual's principal residence.
- (h) The bureau shall validate an identification card for Class B motor driven cycle operation upon a highway by endorsement to an individual who:
 - (1) applies for or has previously been issued an identification card under this chapter;
 - (2) makes the appropriate application for endorsement; and
 - (3) satisfactorily completes the test required under section 3.6 of this chapter.

The bureau shall place a designation on the face of the identification card to indicate that the individual has received a Class B motor driven cycle endorsement.
