Synopsis: Election security. Requires electronic poll books and voting systems used during in-person absentee voting at the circuit court clerk's office or a satellite location to be sealed each day when absentee voting at the site concludes.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 3-11-10-26.4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA

3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 26.4. (a) This section applies to
4	absentee voting conducted at any of the following:
5	(1) The office of the circuit court clerk under section 26 of this
6	chapter.
7	(2) A satellite office established under section 26.3 of this
8	chapter.
9	(3) A vote center established as an absentee satellite voting
10	office under IC 3-11-18.1-4.
11	(b) As used in this section, "unit" refers to either of the
12	following:
13	(1) A voting system.
14	(2) An electronic poll book.
15	(c) At the end of each day that absentee voting occurs, the
16	absentee voting board at a location described in subsection (a) shall
17	do all of the following:

1	(1) Attach a tamper-proof, numbered seal to each unit used
2	during absentee voting.
3	(2) Record the number of the seal affixed to each unit.
4	(3) Provide a list of the units and the number of each unit's
5	seal to the county election board.
6	A seal must make it impossible to access the sealed part of the unit
7	to which the seal is attached without detection. The election
8	division shall prescribe the form of the seal and the information
9	that must be contained on the seal.
10	(d) Before the opening of absentee voting each day that it
11	occurs, the absentee voter board shall determine, for each unit to
12	which a seal was attached under subsection (c), that the seal
13	attached to the unit:
14	(1) is intact;
15	(2) shows no evidence of tampering; and
16	(3) bears the number indicated on the list provided to the
17	county election board by the absentee voter board.
18	(e) If a seal complies with subsection (d), the absentee voter
19	board shall attest to that fact by executing a form prescribed under
20	IC 3-5-4-8.
21	(f) If the absentee voter board determines that a seal does not
22	comply with subsection (d), the absentee voter board shall
23	immediately notify the county election board of that fact.
24	(g) A county election board may adopt, by unanimous vote of
25	the entire board, a resolution to establish alternative procedures to
26	secure units used for absentee voting under this section. To be
27	effective, a resolution adopted under this subsection must be filed
28	with the election division not later than noon three (3) days after
29	the resolution is adopted by the county election board.
