DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 4-33; IC 7.1-2-2-13; IC 10-11-2-13; IC 14-9-8-28.

Synopsis: Salaries of state enforcement officers. Requires, beginning July 1, 2019, that the salaries of the following be adjusted annually to incorporate any increase in the Consumer Price Index: (1) Police employees of the state police department. (2) Gaming agents and gaming control officers of the Indiana gaming commission. (3) Enforcement officers of the alcohol and tobacco commission. (4) Enforcement officers of the natural resources commission.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

(2) the highest salary in the rank paid to a person with at least twenty (20) years of service in the department.

(1) the base salary in the rank paid to a person with less than one

15 (2) the highest salary in the rank paid to a person with at least16 twenty (20) years of service in the department.

(b) Beginning July 1, 2019, the salaries of enforcement officers

(d) (e) The requirement of subsection (c) (d) does not affect:

(1) any rights or liabilities accrued; or

(2) any proceedings begun;

on or before June 30, 1999. Those rights, liabilities, and proceedings
 continue and shall be imposed and enforced under prior civil law and
 procedure as if the requirement of subsection (c) (d) had not been
 enacted.
