DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Educator salary increase grant. Provides an annual grant to school corporations to provide a 2.5% salary increase to licensed teachers, school counselors, social workers with at least a master's degree, and school psychologists. Appropriates \$315,000,000 for the biennium to make grant distributions in both state fiscal years.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

SENATE BILL No. 399

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning education and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019] (a) As used in this
2	SECTION, "educator" means any of the following:
3	(1) A professional person whose position in a school
4	corporation requires a license (as defined in IC 20-28-1-7) and
5	whose primary responsibility is the instruction of students in
6	the classroom or virtual classroom.
7	(2) A licensed school counselor.
8	(3) A licensed social worker who has obtained at least a
9	master's degree.
10	(4) A licensed school psychologist.
11	(b) There is appropriated from the state general fund for the
12	biennium three hundred fifteen million dollars (\$315,000,000) to
13	the department of education (department) for distribution to
14	school corporations throughout the state for an annual educator
15	salary grant under this SECTION.
16	(c) To receive a grant distribution for an upcoming state fiscal
17	year, a school corporation must provide the following to the



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1 department before July 1: 2 (1) The salaries of all educators that will be in effect during 3 the upcoming state fiscal year. 4 (2) A resolution verifying that the school corporation will 5 increase its educator salaries by at least two and one-half 6 percent (2.5%) for the upcoming state fiscal year. 7 If a school corporation does not provide the salary information and 8 the resolution before July 1, a grant may not be provided to a 9 school corporation. 10 (d) Before July 15, the department shall calculate for each 11 school corporation an annual grant amount equal to the cost of 12 providing a two and one-half percent (2.5%) increase in salaries 13 for all educators for the state fiscal year. In addition, during the 14 state fiscal year, the department shall use the latest salary data 15 submitted by a school corporation to: 16 (1) verify that salary increases of at least two and one-half 17 percent (2.5%) were provided to all educators for the state 18 fiscal year; and 19 (2) adjust the grant amount to reflect the actual cost to the 20 school corporation of providing a two and one-half percent 21 (2.5%) increase in salaries for all educators for the state fiscal 22 year. 23 The department shall provide one-twelfth (1/12) of the fiscal year 24 grant amount with each distribution of state tuition support to a 25 school corporation, as adjusted under this subsection. 26 (e) This SECTION expires June 30, 2021.
