A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

I	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019] (a) As used in this
2	SECTION, "task force" means the economic and regulatory policy
3	task force established by subsection (b).
4	(b) The economic and regulatory policy task force is established
5	(c) The task force consists of the following members:
6	(1) Two (2) members appointed by the president pro tempore
7	of the senate. The members appointed under this subdivision
8	may be legislators. At least one (1) member appointed under
9	this subdivision must be experienced in the field of finance or
0	business management.
1	(2) Two (2) members appointed by the minority leader of the
2	senate. The members appointed under this subdivision may be
3	legislators. At least one (1) member appointed under this
4	subdivision must be experienced in the field of finance or

6	(3) Two (2) members appointed by the speaker of the house of
7	representatives. The members appointed under this
8	subdivision may be legislators. At least one (1) member

21	is not entitled to the minimum salary per diem provided under
22	IC 4-10-11-2.1(b). The member is, however, entitled to
23	reimbursement for traveling expenses as provided under
24	IC 4-13-1-4 and other expenses actually incurred in connection
25	with the member's duties as provided in the state policies and
26	procedures established by the Indiana department of
27	administration and approved by the budget agency.
28	(f) Each member of the task force who is a state employee but
29	who is not a member of the general assembly is entitled to
30	reimbursement for traveling expenses as provided under
31	IC 4-13-1-4 and other expenses actually incurred in connection
32	with the member's duties as provided in the state policies and
33	procedures established by the Indiana department of
34	administration and approved by the budget agency.
35	(g) Each member of the task force who is a member of the
36	general assembly is entitled to receive the same per diem, mileage

A quorum consists of a majority of the voting members 3 appointed to the task force. 4 (j) The affirmative votes of a majority of the voting members 5 appointed to the task force are required for the task force to take 6 action on any measure, including adopting a final report. 7 (k) The chairperson may establish and appoint task force 8 members to subcommittees as the chairperson considers 9 appropriate to carry out the task force's duties under subsection 10 (l). The chairperson shall name the chairperson of each 11 subcommittee. 12 (I) The task force shall do the following: 13 14 15
 - (1) Assess the analysis and approval procedures for federal grant applications by state agencies and local governments and make recommendations for reducing dependency on federal funds.
 - (2) Evaluate and make recommendations to improve state agencies' financial management, risk management, performance management, and internal controls framework, including improvements to better align those systems with core government functions.
 - (3) Make recommendations to enhance financial and performance audit procedures.
 - (4) Make recommendations to enhance legislative oversight of economic and regulatory policies, including submission of reports on implementation of prescribed policies.
 - (5) Evaluate economic and occupational regulatory framework at the state and local levels and make recommendations to enhance market competition and eliminate barriers of entry for small businesses.
 - (6) Assess ways to enhance transparency and simplify the reporting of public information by state and local government using resources of the management performance hub established by IC 4-3-26-8 and the office of technology established by IC 4-13.1-2-1.
 - (7) Make recommendations to strengthen financial and reporting functions of local governments.
 - (m) The office of the governor shall provide staff support to the task force.
 - (n) The task force shall provide its final recommendations before October 1, 2020, to the governor and to the legislative council in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
