

### SENATE BILL No. 424

DIGEST OF SB 424 (Updated February 20, 2023 12:30 pm - DI 150)

Citations Affected: IC 14-8; IC 14-15.

**Synopsis:** Lake Michigan rescue equipment. Requires the owner of a pier or public access site on Lake Michigan to install public rescue equipment, including at least one ring life buoy, on the pier or public access site. Establishes requirements concerning ring life buoys installed on piers and public access sites. Provides that the end of the buoy line must not be secured to the shore. Requires a unit of local government that owns one or more piers or public access sites on Lake Michigan, at least twice per year, to publish on the unit's website a report on lakefront drownings that occur within 50 feet of the unit's piers or public access sites. Provides that if more than one fatal drowning occurs not more than 50 feet from a particular pier or public access site: (1) disseminate in the area of the pier or public access site a water safety plan pertaining to the pier or public access site; and (2) upgrade the public rescue equipment installed on the pier or public access site, such as by installing equipment that automatically contacts the local 911 service in an emergency.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

17	(ii) to protect or form a harbor.
18	(2) "Public access site" means a site that is:
19	(A) government owned; and
20	(B) intended to facilitate direct public access to the water.
21	The term does not include the public trust (as described in
22	IC 14-26-2.1-3) or areas on state owned property where
23 24	swimming is prohibited.
24	(3) "Public rescue equipment" means water rescue devices
25	available for public use in case of an emergency, including
26	ring life buoys, throw bags, rescue tubes, and rescue poles.
27	Sec. 2. (a) The owner of a pier or public access site on Lake
28	Michigan shall install public rescue equipment on the pier or
29	public access site. The public rescue equipment installed on a pier
30	or public access site under this subsection:

32	(2) may include other types of public rescue equipment.
33	(b) The owner of a pier or public access site on Lake Michigan:
34	(1) shall oversee the installation and maintenance of the public
35	rescue equipment required by this section; and
36	(2) if the owner is the state of Indiana or a unit of local
37	government, shall also provide public education concerning
38	the public rescue equipment installed on the pier or public

10	Sec. 3. (a) The following apply to a ring life buoy installed on a
11	pier or public access site under section 2(a) of this chapter:
12	(1) The ring life buoy must not be permanently secured in any



1	way to a station, rack, or pier.
2	(2) The ring life buoy must be stowed inside a station to
3	protect it from constant weather exposure.
4	(3) The ring life buoy must meet the requirements of:
5	(A) 46 CFR 160.050; or
6	(B) 46 CFR 160.150;
7	for Safety Of Life At Sea (SOLAS) approved equipment, or
8	must meet other standards for public rescue equipment issued
9	by the United States Coast Guard.
10	(4) There must be attached to each ring life buoy a buoyant
11	line:
12	(A) that:
13	(i) is at least fifty (50) feet long; or
14	(ii) if the ring life buoy is secured to a station, rack, or
15	pier more than fifty (50) feet away from the Lake
16	Michigan shoreline, is at least twenty-five (25) feet
17	longer than the distance between the station, rack, or
18	pier to which the ring life buoy is secured and the Lake
19	Michigan shoreline;
20	(B) that has a breaking strength of at least five (5)
21	kilonewtons; and
22	(C) the end of which must not be secured to the shore.
23	(5) The ring life buoy must be marked with type II
24	retroreflective material meeting the requirements of 46 CFR
25	164.018.
26	(6) The ring life buoy:
27	(A) must be placed not more than two hundred (200) feet
28	from the shoreline of Lake Michigan; and
29	(B) must be available for emergency rescue operations.
30	(b) A station in which a ring life buoy is stowed under
31	subsection (a)(2) must:
32	(1) be a bright orange or yellow color for high visibility to aid
33	with quick access to the ring life buoy; and
34	(2) bear signage that warns lakefront patrons that tampering
35	with or misusing public rescue equipment is strictly
36	prohibited.
37	Sec. 4. (a) A unit of local government that owns one (1) or more
38	piers or public access sites on Lake Michigan shall:
39	(1) compile information; and
40	(2) at least twice per year, publish on the unit's website a
41	report;
42	on lakefront drownings of which the unit is aware that have



1	occurred within fifty (50) feet of a pier or public access site owned
2	by the unit of local government.
3	(b) A report published under subsection (a)(2) must include at
4	least the following information:
5	(1) The location of each drowning.
6	(2) The time of day at which the drowning occurred and the
7	temperature and weather conditions at the time and place of
8	the drowning.
9	(3) A description of:
10	(A) the public rescue equipment that was accessible at the
11	pier or public access site within fifty (50) feet of the place
12	of the drowning;
13	(B) how the public rescue equipment described under
14	clause (A) may be used; and
15	(C) the type of entry into the water of Lake Michigan that
16	is available at the pier or public access site within fifty (50)
17	feet of the place of the drowning.
18	(c) If a drowning has occurred within fifty (50) feet of a pier or
19	public access site owned by a unit of local government since the
20	previous report of the unit of local government was published
21	under subsection (a)(2), the unit of local government shall publish
22	on its website, in addition to the report required by subsection
23	(a)(2), a water safety plan pertaining to the pier or public access
24	site.
25	Sec. 5. If more than one (1) drowning occurs not more than fifty
26	(50) feet from a particular pier or public access site in a span of
27	five (5) years, the owner of the pier or public access site shall:
28	(1) disseminate in the area of the pier or public access site a
29	water safety plan pertaining to the pier or public access site;
30	and
31	(2) upgrade the public rescue equipment installed on the pier
32	or public access site under section 2(a) of this chapter, such as
33	by installing equipment that automatically contacts the local
34	911 service in an emergency.
35	Sec. 6. The department shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to



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implement this chapter.
