DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 16-28.

Synopsis: Health facility nursing staff requirements. Requires a health facility to comply with the following: (1) Have a registered nurse present at the health facility at all times when a resident is in the care of the health facility. (2) Require a registered nurse to delegate certain duties. (3) Provide that there is not less than 4 1/10 hours per resident day of direct nursing care, with not less than 30% of the direct nursing care being provided by licensed nurses. (4) Employ a director of nursing who has obtained certain education or certification.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

13	(1) Require a registered nurse to be present at the health

16	(2) Delegate to a registered nurse the following duties:
17	(A) Oversight of resident care and assessment.
18	(B) Supervision of the nursing staff.
19	(C) Delegation of responsibilities to certified nurse aides

21	(3) Subject to subsections (b) and (c), provide that the number
22	of hours of direct nursing care is not less than four and
23	one-tenth (4 1/10) hours per resident day, with not less than
24	thirty percent (30%) of the direct nursing care being provided
25	by nurses licensed under IC 25-23.
26	(4) Employ a director of nursing who has obtained one (1) of
27	the following:
28	(A) At least a bachelor's degree from an accredited college
29	or university in nursing administration.
30	(B) A certificate in nursing administration issued or
31	endorsed by any of the following:
32	(i) The Coalition of Geriatric Nursing Organizations or
33	its successor organization.
34	(ii) The American Nurses Association or its successor
35	organization.
36	(iii) An organization or association approved by the state
37	department.
38	(b) When calculating the number of hours of direct nursing care
39	under subsection (a)(3), the health facility may not include the
40	hours of nurses who are employed in administrative positions,
41	including the director and assistant director of nursing.
42	(c) The daily minimum number of hours of direct nursing care



- at a health facility may not be less than is necessary for the clinical acuity of the residents of the health facility.
