Requires the department of child services to administer services and programs for the: (1) prevention of child sexual abuse and exploitation; and (2) treatment and assistance for victims of child sexual abuse and the families of victims of child sexual abuse.

6	(B) information to increase the understanding and
7	recognition of warning signs that a child may be a victim

2	(C) information on reporting duties and intervention
3	approaches if a child is believed to be a victim of child
4	sexual abuse or exploitation; and
5	(D) resources available for victims of child sexual abuse
6	and the families of victims of child sexual abuse;
7	(2) counseling and assistance targeted to the needs of victims
8	of child sexual abuse and families of victims of child sexual
9	abuse, which may include cooperation with state and local
10	agencies and organizations that provide counseling and
11	assistance focused on victims of child sexual abuse and the
12	families of victims; and
13	(3) training for local office employees on treatments and
14	services targeted to the needs of victims of child sexual abuse
15	and exploitation.
