SENATE BILL No. 444

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 11-8; IC 11-10-3.5; IC 11-12-4-1.

Synopsis: Incarcerated women's maternal health fund. Establishes the Officer Breann Leath Memorial Prison Nursery (nursery) within a correctional facility determined by the commissioner of the department of correction (DOC). Specifies the criteria for operation, design, and implementation of the nursery and minimum standards that govern the nursery. Requires the DOC to provide an annual report to the legislative council concerning the nursery. Amends the statute requiring the DOC to adopt rules governing minimum standards for county jails to include the provision of menstrual discharge collection devices to inmates. Establishes the incarcerated women's maternal health fund to provide funds to support the nursery. Makes a continuing appropriation.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning corrections and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

14	(1) Appropriations made by the general assembly.
15	(2) Gifts, bequests, donations, contributions, and grants from
16	any public or private source.
17	(d) The department shall administer the fund.

27	Nursery is established within a correctional facility determined by

29	(b) The department shall operate the nursery and shall ensure							
30	that the operation, design, and implementation of the nursery is							
31	undertaken with the consultation and guidance of subject matter							
32	experts, who are not employed by the department or a vendor of							
33	the department, from the following fields:							
34	(1) Maternal health.							
35	(2) Public health.							
36	(3) Pediatrics.

38	(c) To implement this section, the department shall adopt rules							
39	under IC 4-22-2 that contain the following minimum standards:

30	(b) The department shall adopt under IC 4-22-2 minimum standards
31	for county jails governing the following:
32	(1) General physical and environmental conditions.
33	(2) Services and programs to be provided to confined persons.
34	(3) Procedures for the care and control of confined persons that
35	are necessary to ensure the health and safety of confined persons,
36	the security of the jail, and public safety. and
37	(4) The restraint of pregnant inmates. Rules adopted under this

However, the department may not adopt any standard that prohibits the placement of more than one (1) prisoner in a prisoner cell that has thirty-five (35) square feet or more of floor space per prisoner.

- (b) (c) The standards must be sufficiently flexible to foster the development of new and improved practices and to accommodate local needs and circumstances. The standards must be consistent with the laws of Indiana and the rules of the Indiana department of health and the fire prevention and building safety commission.
- (c) (d) The commissioner shall select a committee of not less than five (5) county sheriffs to consult with the department before and during the drafting of the proposed minimum standards. County sheriffs shall be selected from the various classes of counties to ensure that densely, moderately, and sparsely populated counties are represented. Each county sheriff is entitled to the minimum salary per diem as provided in IC 4-10-11-2.1 for each day engaged in the official business of the committee and to reimbursement for traveling and other expenses, as provided in the state travel policies and procedures established by the Indiana department of administration and approved by the budget agency.
- (d) (e) At least sixty (60) days before setting the date for a public hearing under IC 4-22-2, the department shall forward copies of the proposed minimum standards to each county sheriff and each board of county commissioners and shall solicit their views and suggestions.
