DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 13-23.

Synopsis: Excess liability trust fund. Provides that the administrator shall, not later than March 31, 2020, pay claims for costs from the excess liability trust fund (ELTF) for claims submitted within a specified period of time. Establishes a formula for paying claims for reimbursement from the ELTF to claimants before the establishment of standards for reasonableness and cost effectiveness by the underground storage tank financial assurance board.

Effective: Upon passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning environmental law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 13-23-9-1.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.200-2017,
2	SECTION 15, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 1.5. (a) The administrator may pay ELTF
4	claims only for costs that:
5	(1) are reasonable and cost effective; and
6	(2) result from or reimburse the claimant for the following:
7	(A) Work performed for site characterization.
8	(B) Development and implementation of a corrective action
9	plan that:
0	(i) is approved by the commissioner under rules adopted by
1	the environmental rules board; and
2	(ii) has not been suspended.
3	(C) Work performed as part of an emergency response
4	necessary to abate an immediate threat of harm to human
5	health, property, or the environment.
6	(D) Third party indemnification claims submitted in
7	accordance with section 3 of this chapter.



1	(E) Reasonable attorney's fees incurred in defense of third
2	party claims.
3	(F) Releases that occurred on or after April 1, 1988.
4	(G) Compensation paid by the claimant to technicians for
5	services performed in preparation of the claimant's ELTF
6	claim.
7	(b) The administrator may shall also pay ELTF claims for costs not
8	described in subsection (a) if allowed under rules adopted by the
9	financial assurance board.
10	(c) This subsection applies only to an ELTF claim for costs that:
l 1	(1) is submitted after January 1, 2019, and before February
12	27, 2019; and
13	(2) was denied for the reason that the claimant was
14	determined not to be an eligible party.
15	The administrator shall pay an ELTF claim for costs to a claimant
16	described in this subsection not later than March 31, 2020.
17	SECTION 2. IC 13-23-11-7.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
18	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
19	[EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 7.5. (a) This section applies to
20	a claim paid by the administrator to a claimant before the
21	establishment of standards for determining reasonableness and
22	cost effectiveness under section 7 of this chapter.
23	(b) The administrator shall pay a claim described in subsection
24	(a) to a claimant in an amount that:
25	(1) is equal to the average percentage of the dollar amount of
26	all claims submitted by a claimant; and
27	(2) was reimbursed by the administrator for the three (3) year
28	period beginning January 1, 2015, and ending December 31,
29	2017.
30	(c) A claim paid to a claimant using the formula established in
31	subsection (b) satisfies the standard for reasonableness and cost
32	effectiveness until the board establishes standards under section 7
33	of this chapter.
34	SECTION 3. An emergency is declared for this act.
